**WEATHER BRIEF for today Sunday, 09 March 2025, from the Hydrometeorological Service, Guyana**





Rainfall records for the past 24 hours, measured at 08:00 hrs Sunday, March 9, 2025, were available for most stations.

**Karawab in Region 2 recorded the highest rainfall of 66.3 mm.**

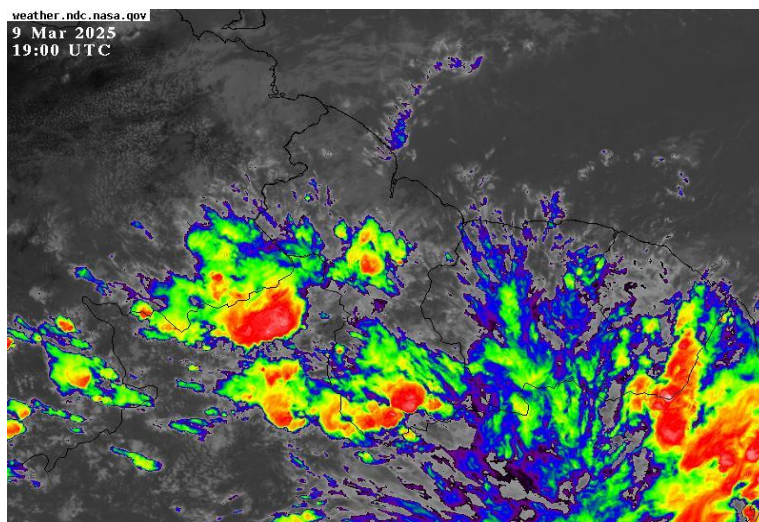
**Severe Weather Advisory:** Given the observed conditions over the past 24-48 hours, along with current and forecast conditions for southern regions 6 and 9, soils may already be saturated and additional rainfall may lead to flooding. Persons are asked to take the necessary precautions to safeguard life and property.

**Synopsis:** The atmosphere over Southern Guyana continues to remain very highly unstable. Strong plumes of moisture embedded within low level troughs are moving across these areas. This pattern is expected to continue for the remainder of the week. The remainder of the country also experienced mild to moderate instabilities. Moisture plumes within the trades are also responsible for these instabilities over Northern Guyana. Meteorological models are indicating that most of Northern Guyana is expected to become very unstable beginning from Wednesday and continuing as the week progresses.

**Today's weather review:** Cloudy skies with isolated to scattered showers were observed over most of Southern Guyana. Partly cloudy skies elsewhere.

**Extended Forecast**

**Tuesday:** Partly cloudy to cloudy skies with isolated showers can be expected over the Coastal areas during the morning. Conditions are expected to improve from the afternoon as fair and sunny skies will likely persist. Inland and Southern Guyana can expect mostly cloudy skies with scattered showers and continuous rain from the afternoon. ***Rainfall is expected between 5.0 mm and 25.0 mm.***

**Wednesday thru Sunday:** Cloudy to overcast skies with scattered to frequent showers of varying intensities and continuous rain can be expected over most of Guyana. Isolated thundershowers are also likely over Inland and Southern regions. ***Rainfall is expected between 25.0 mm and 60.0 mm within 24 hours.***
