WEATHER BRIEF for today Monday, 09 March 2026, from the Hydrometeorological Service, Guyana

Rainfall records for the past 24 hours, measured at 08:00 hrs Monday, March 9, 2026, were available for most stations.

Bartica Forestry in Region 7 recorded the highest rainfall of 31.0 mm.


Marine advisory: Moderate to rough seas, will likely result in hazardous sea conditions. All marine users are asked to take the necessary precautions.

Synopsis: Scattered pockets of instabilities were observed over the forecast area. Low level convergence was analyzed over the forecast area. This will likely continue for the next 12 to 36 hours. A steady increase in low level moisture is expected from Thursday and continue for the remainder of the week and into the weekend. This would likely enhance rainfall over Guyana.

Today's weather review: Partly cloudy to cloudy skies with isolated to scattered showers can be expected over Inland areas.

Extended Forecast

Wednesday through Sunday:** Cloudy skies with scattered showers and intermittent rain can be expected over Coastal Guyana during the morning, with conditions expected to improve from the afternoon. Inland and Southern Guyana can expect cloudy skies, becoming overcast at times, with scattered to frequent showers, and intermittent rain can be expected during the afternoon. **Rainfall is expected to range between 20.0 mm and 50.0 mm within 24 hours.
