WEATHER BRIEF for today Thursday, 12 March 2026, from the Hydrometeorological Service, Guyana

Rainfall records for the past 24 hours, measured at 08:00 hrs Thursday, March 12, 2026, were available for most stations.


Dawa South in Region 2 recorded the highest rainfall of 45.6 mm.

Synopsis: Plume of moisture east of Guyana, low-level flow convergence, and the propagation of a low-level trough are increasing instability over Guyana. This creates mild to moderate instabilities. These instabilities are expected to move over areas in regions 7 and 9 during the evening. All remaining areas are expected to experience instabilities during the early morning. This pattern is expected to continue into the weekend, with improvements expected on Monday

Today's weather review: Cloudy skies with scattered showers were observed over Regions 6 and 8.

Extended Forecast

Saturday and Sunday: Cloudy skies with scattered showers and intermittent rain can be expected over Coastal Guyana during the morning, with conditions expected to improve from the afternoon. Inland and Southern Guyana can expect cloudy skies, becoming overcast at times, with scattered to frequent showers, and intermittent rain can be expected during the afternoon. **Rainfall is expected to range between 15.0 mm and 40.0 mm within 24 hours.**

Monday through Wednesday: Cloudy skies with isolated to scattered showers can be expected over the coastal Guyana during the morning, with conditions expected to improve from the afternoon hours as partly cloudy and sunny skies will likely persist. Cloudy skies with scattered showers, of varying intensities, can be expected over Inland and Southern Guyana from the afternoon. **Rainfall is expected to range between 10.0 mm and 30.0 mm within 24 hours.**
