**WEATHER BRIEF for today Monday, 16 March 2026, from the Hydrometeorological Service, Guyana**

Rainfall records for the past 24 hours, measured at 08:00 hrs Monday, March 16, 2026, were available for most stations.

**Mahdia in Region 8 recorded the highest rainfall of 34.0 mm**

**Marine Advisory: Strong surface winds and high-energy waves continue to produce rough and hazardous sea conditions along the coast of Guyana. In addition, spring tides can likely lead to over-topping of sea defences. Fisherfolk, small craft operators, and other mariners are asked to exercise all necessary precautions.**

**Synopsis:** Strong high pressure continues to build toward the central Atlantic and is reaching Northern Guyana. This has resulted in strong winds and will likely continue until Friday. Meanwhile, Southern Guyana continues to experience moderate instabilities as a result of plumes of moisture embedded within low-level troughs, coupled with low-level convergence. Inland Guyana also experienced similar conditions during the morning and is expected to continue into the evening hours. Meteorological models are indicating that isolated pockets of instabilities are expected over Coastal Guyana during the morning period, with generally stable conditions expected after. Inland and Southern Guyana will continue to experience very unstable conditions until Thursday.


**Today's weather review:** Cloudy skies with scattered showers were observed over Southern Regions 6, Regions 8 and 10, and Inland areas along Regions 3 to 5.

**Extended Forecast**

***Wednesday:*** Cloudy skies with scattered showers can be expected over Coastal Guyana during the morning, with conditions expected to improve from the afternoon. Inland and Southern Guyana can expect cloudy skies, becoming overcast at times, with scattered to frequent showers and intermittent rain. **Rainfall is expected to range between 20.0 mm and 60.0 mm within 24 hours, with the highest expected over Inland and Southern Guyana.**

***Thursday through Sunday:*** Cloudy skies with isolated to scattered showers can be expected over the coastal Guyana during the morning, with conditions expected to improve from the afternoon hours as partly cloudy and sunny skies will likely persist. Cloudy skies with scattered showers, of varying intensities, can be expected over Inland and Southern Guyana from the afternoon. **Rainfall is expected to range between 10.0 mm and 30.0 mm within 24 hours.**
