WEATHER BRIEF for today Saturday, 23 May 2026, from the Hydrometeorological Service, Guyana





Rainfall records for the past 24 hours, measured at 08:00 hrs Saturday, May 23, 2026, were available for most stations.

Wowetta in Region 9 recorded the highest rainfall of 80.6 mm.

Severe Weather Warnings: Soils may already be saturated from continuous and heavy rainfall, and with current and forecast conditions indicating more rainfall amounts, which can increase the likelihood and exacerbation of flooding in low-lying areas and areas of poor drainage. Hilly areas can also expect possible mudslides during heavy downpours. In areas of thundershowers, heavy winds and lightning strikes may be observed. Persons are asked to be alert and exercise caution in efforts to safeguard life and property.

Synopsis: Tropical wave #5 created mild to moderate instabilities over Coastal Guyana during the morning period and moved further Inland as the day progressed and produced more deep convection over these areas. Meteorological models are indicating that more convective activity is expected over Inland areas. Southern Guyana is also expected to observe moderate convection throughout the night. Coastal Guyana will also likely experience early morning instabilities. Low-level convergence, low to mid-level troughs embedded in deep moisture plumes, and favourable upper-level dynamics are the driving forces behind these instabilities.

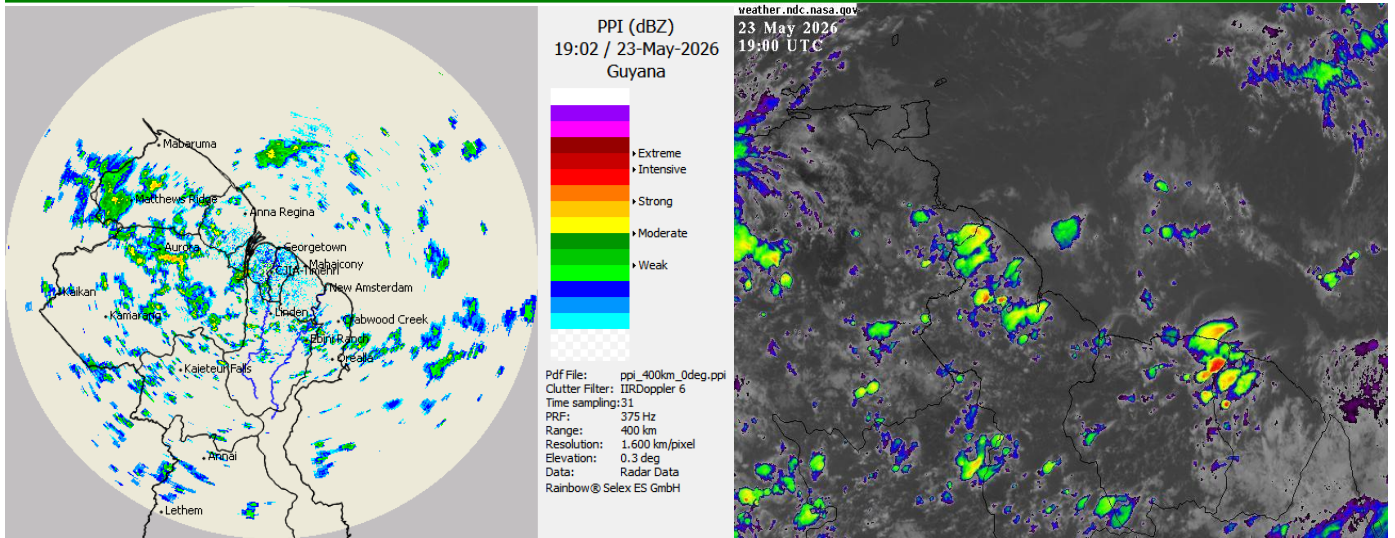
Today's weather review: Cloudy skies with isolated to scattered showers were observed over Inland Guyana.

Extended Forecast

Monday, Thursday, and Friday: Cloudy skies with isolated to scattered showers and rain can be expected over Coastal Guyana during the morning hours. Improvements are expected from the afternoon as partly cloudy skies will likely persist. Inland areas and Southern Guyana can expect cloudy skies with scattered showers and rain. **Rainfall is expected to range between 5.0 mm and 40.0 mm within 24 hours.**

Tuesday and Wednesday: Partly cloudy to fair, hazy and sunny skies can be expected over Coastal Guyana, with no significant rainfall expected. Cloudy skies with isolated to scattered showers and rain, ranging from light to moderate, can be expected elsewhere, mostly during the afternoon. **Rainfall is expected to range between 5.0 mm and 25.0 mm.**
