WEATHER BRIEF for today Monday, 03 November 2025, from the Hydrometeorological Service, Guyana

Rainfall records for the past 24 hours, measured at 08:00 hrs Monday, November 3, 2025, were available for most stations.

Melville Wakenaam in Region 3 recorded the highest rainfall of 126.7mm.

Severe Weather Advisory: In areas of thundershowers, lightning strikes and heavy winds may be observed. Persons should exercise caution in efforts to safeguard life and property.

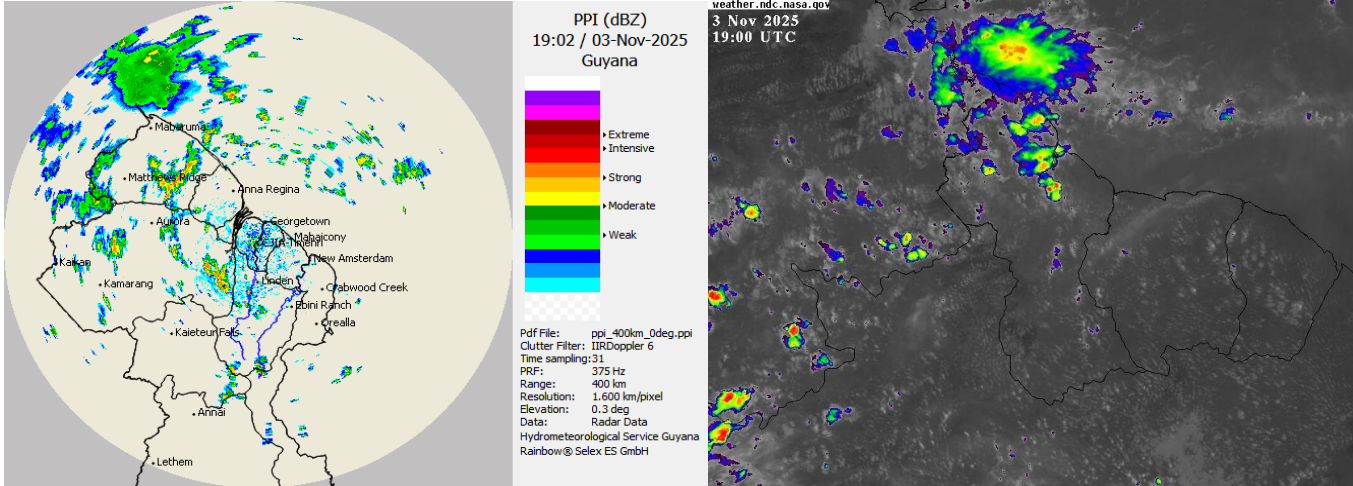
Marine advisory: Citizens are advised that the spring tide advisory is in effect. Residents of low-lying, riverine, and flood-prone areas are advised to take the necessary precautions against flooding as over-topping is likely.

Synopsis: The ITCZ was observed over Regions 1 and 2 throughout the day, and this created mild to moderate convection over those areas. The effects of this system are expected to continue over these Regions for the next 12 hours and as the week progresses. However, all remaining areas will likely experience generally stable conditions with isolated pockets of mild to moderate instabilities. Coastal Regions 3 to 6 will likely experience these conditions during the morning, followed by mostly stable conditions, while Inland Guyana is expected to observe during the afternoon.

Today's weather review: Cloudy skies with scattered showers were observed over Regions 1 and 2. Partly cloudy to sunny, elsewhere.

SPRING TIDE ADVISORY: CITIZENS ARE ADVISED THAT THE SPRING TIDE ADVISORY IS IN EFFECT. RESIDENTS OF LOW-LYING, RIVERINE, AND FLOOD-PRONE AREAS ARE ADVISED TO TAKE THE NECESSARY PRECAUTIONS AGAINST FLOODING AS OVER-TOPPING IS LIKELY.

SEA CONDITIONS: SLIGHT TO MODERATE SEAS WITH EASTERLY WAVES REACHING HEIGHTS OF 1.0 TO 2.0 METERS IN OPEN WATERS. THESE WAVES ARE LIKELY TO HAVE PERIODS OF 6 AND 7 SECONDS. MODERATE EASTERLY BREEZE.

Extended Forecast

Wednesday, Thursday, Saturday, and Sunday: Partly cloudy skies with isolated showers can be expected over Coastal Regions 2 to 6 during the morning hours, with partly cloudy to sunny skies likely to persist from mid-morning. Region 1, including Inland and Southern Guyana, can expect cloudy to overcast skies with isolated showers and thundershowers from the afternoon. ***Rainfall is expected to be between 0.0 and 15.0 mm within 24 hours.***

Friday: Cloudy to overcast skies with isolated to scattered showers of varying intensities, and intermittent rain can be expected over most of the forecast area.. Inland and Hinterland can expect isolated showers and thundershowers during the afternoon. **Rainfall is anticipated to be between 5.0 and 40.0 mm.**
