WEATHER BRIEF for today Thursday, 06 November 2025, from the Hydrometeorological Service, Guyana

Rainfall records for the past 24 hours, measured at 08:00 hrs Thursday, November 6, 2025, were available for most stations.

Santa Rosa in Region 1 recorded the highest rainfall of 30.1 mm.

Severe Weather Advisory: In areas of thundershowers, lightning strikes and heavy winds may be observed. Persons should exercise caution when safeguarding life and property.

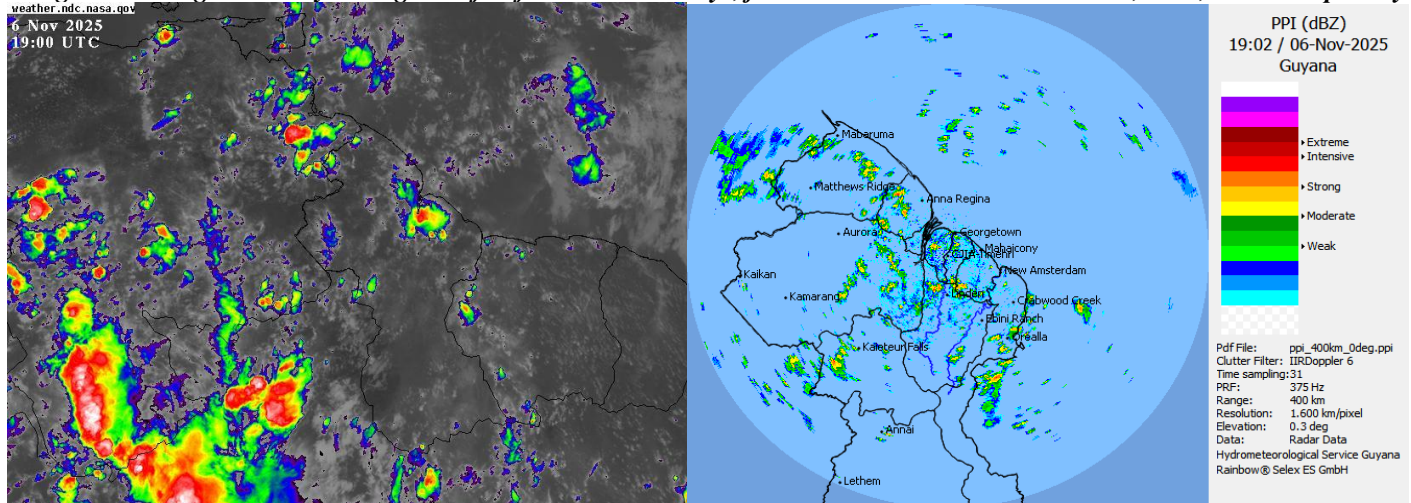
Marine advisory: Citizens are advised that the spring tide advisory is in effect. Residents of low-lying, riverine, and flood-prone areas are advised to take the necessary precautions against flooding as over-topping is likely.

Synopsis: The ITCZ, coupled with low-level troughs, is the dominant feature of interest affecting the forecast area. This pattern is expected to continue for the next 12 to 24 hours. The ITCZ is expected to remain active over Regions 1 and 2 into the weekend and then move slowly south and begin to affect areas over Regions 3 to 6. Inland and Southern Guyana also experienced mild to moderate instabilities as moisture plumes continued to move across these areas. Stable conditions are likely over the weekend in Southern Guyana.

Today's weather review: *Cloudy skies with scattered showers were observed over Regions 1, 2, and Inland areas along Regions 3 to 6. Partly cloudy to sunny, elsewhere.*

SPRING TIDE ADVISORY: CITIZENS ARE ADVISED THAT THE SPRING TIDE ADVISORY IS IN EFFECT. RESIDENTS OF LOW-LYING, RIVERINE, AND FLOOD-PRONE AREAS ARE ADVISED TO TAKE THE NECESSARY PRECAUTIONS AGAINST FLOODING AS OVER-TOPPING IS LIKELY.

SEA CONDITIONS: SLIGHT TO MODERATE SEAS WITH EASTERLY WAVES REACHING HEIGHTS OF 1.0 TO 2.0 METERS IN OPEN WATERS. THESE WAVES ARE LIKELY TO HAVE PERIODS OF 5 AND 7 SECONDS. GENTLE TO MODERATE EASTERLY BREEZE.

Extended Forecast

Saturday, Sunday, and Wednesday: Cloudy skies with isolated to scattered showers can be expected over Coastal Regions 2 to 6 during the morning hours, with partly cloudy to sunny skies likely to persist from mid-morning. Region 1, Inland and Southern Guyana, can expect cloudy to overcast skies with isolated to scattered showers and thundershowers from the afternoon. **Rainfall is expected to be between 5.0 and 30.0 mm within 24 hours.**

Monday and Tuesday: Cloudy to overcast skies with isolated to scattered showers of varying intensities, and intermittent rain can be expected over Northern Guyana throughout the morning hours. Inland and Hinterland can expect isolated showers and thundershowers during the afternoon. ***Rainfall is anticipated to be between 20.0 and 70.0 mm within 24 hours, with the highest expected over Northern Guyana.***
