WEATHER BRIEF for today Sunday, 09 November 2025, from the Hydrometeorological Service, Guyana

Rainfall records for the past 24 hours, measured at 08:00 hrs Sunday, November 9, 2025, were available for most stations.

Sophia in Region 4 recorded the highest rainfall of 25.4 mm.

Severe Weather Advisory: Given that it the already been saturated from heavy rainfall, and with forecast conditions indicating a high chance of more rainfall. This can likely lead to flooding or exacerbate flooding in low-lying areas and areas of poor drainage. In areas of thundershowers, lightning strikes and heavy winds may be observed. Persons should exercise caution when safeguarding life and property.

Marine advisory: Citizens are advised that the spring tide advisory comes to an end tonight. Residents of low-lying, riverine, and flood-prone areas are advised to take the necessary precautions against flooding as over-topping is likely.

Synopsis: *A Low to mid-level trough coupled with moisture convergence from the ITCZ was responsible for mild to moderate instabilities in Regions 1 to 7 and 10 during the morning hours. These conditions continued over Regions 1, 7, and 10 as the day progressed. These areas are expected to remain unstable for the remainder of the week as the ITCZ is coupled with these low to mid-level troughs. Southern Guyana will likely experience mild instabilities during the afternoon period.*

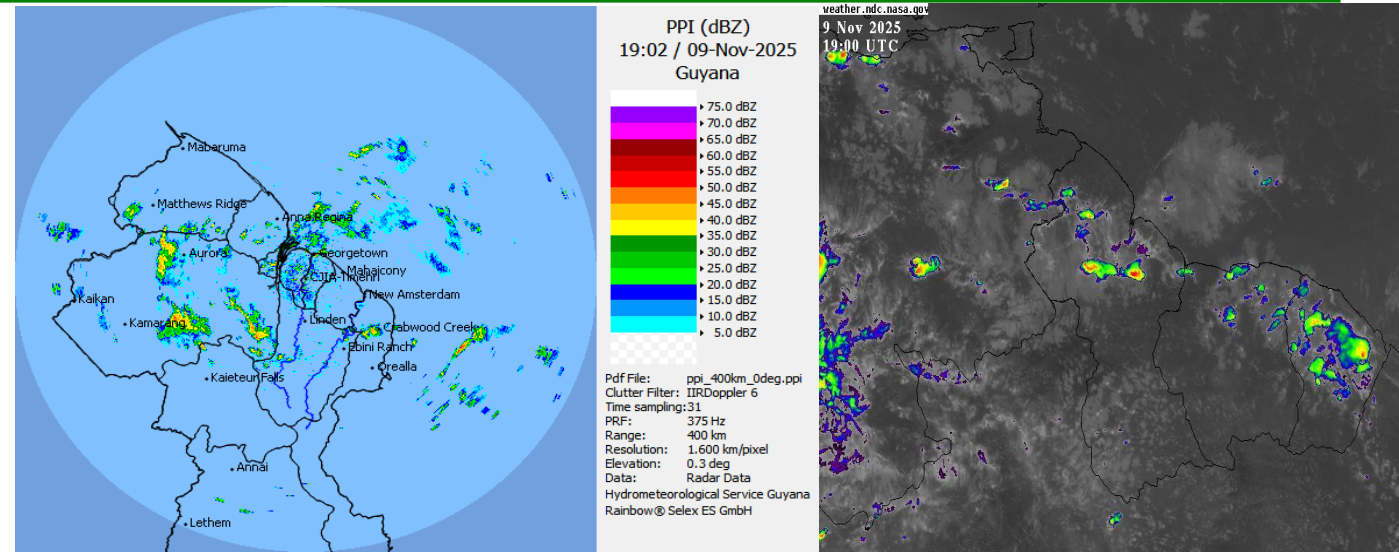
Today's weather review: Cloudy skies with scattered showers were observed over Regions 1 to 7 and 10.

SPRING TIDE ADVISORY: CITIZENS ARE ADVISED THAT THE SPRING TIDE ADVISORY COMES TO AN END TONIGHT. RESIDENTS OF LOW-LYING, RIVERINE, AND FLOOD-PRONE AREAS ARE ADVISED TO TAKE THE NECESSARY PRECAUTIONS AGAINST FLOODING AS OVER-TOPPING IS LIKELY.

SEA CONDITIONS: MODERATE SEAS WITH NORTHEASTERLY TO EASTERLY WAVES REACHING HEIGHTS OF 1.5 TO 2.0 METERS IN OPEN WATERS. THESE WAVES ARE LIKELY TO HAVE PERIODS OF 7 AND 8 SECONDS. MODERATE TO FRESH EASTERLY BREEZE.

Extended Forecast

Tuesday through Friday: Cloudy to overcast skies with isolated to scattered showers of varying intensities, and periods of rain can be expected over Northern Guyana throughout the morning hours. Inland and Hinterland can expect isolated showers and thundershowers during the afternoon. **Rainfall is anticipated to be between 25.0 and 75.0 mm within 24 hours, with the highest expected over Northern Guyana.**

Saturday: Cloudy skies with isolated to scattered showers can be expected over Coastal Regions 2 to 6 during the morning hours, with partly cloudy to sunny skies likely to persist from mid-morning. Region 1, Inland and Southern Guyana, can expect cloudy to overcast skies with isolated to scattered showers and thundershowers from the afternoon. **Rainfall is expected to be between 5.0 and 30.0 mm within 24 hours.**
