WEATHER BRIEF for today Tuesday, 11 November 2025, from the Hydrometeorological Service, Guyana

Rainfall records for the past 24 hours, measured at 08:00 hrs Tuesday, November 11, 2025, were available for most stations.

Wowetta in Region 9 recorded the highest rainfall of 49.3 mm.

Severe Weather Advisory: Given recent rainfall and forecast conditions indicating more rainfall, soils may already be saturated, which can lead to or exacerbate flooding in low-lying and poorly drained areas of region one. In areas of thundershowers, lightning strikes and strong winds can also be expected. Persons should exercise caution when safeguarding life and property.

Synopsis: *A trough in the Atlantic, which is also analyzed over Regions 1 and 2, coupled with moisture convergence, was responsible for mild to moderate convection over these Regions. These conditions are likely to continue into the evening hours. Regions 6 to 10 also experience mild to moderate instabilities due to the moisture convergence from the ITCZ. Upper-level dynamics are also favorable for deep convective development. This is also expected to continue into the evening hours. Unstable conditions are expected to continue over these areas until Thursday. All remaining areas observed mild instabilities. Stable conditions are likely to return from Saturday over Regions 3 to 5.*

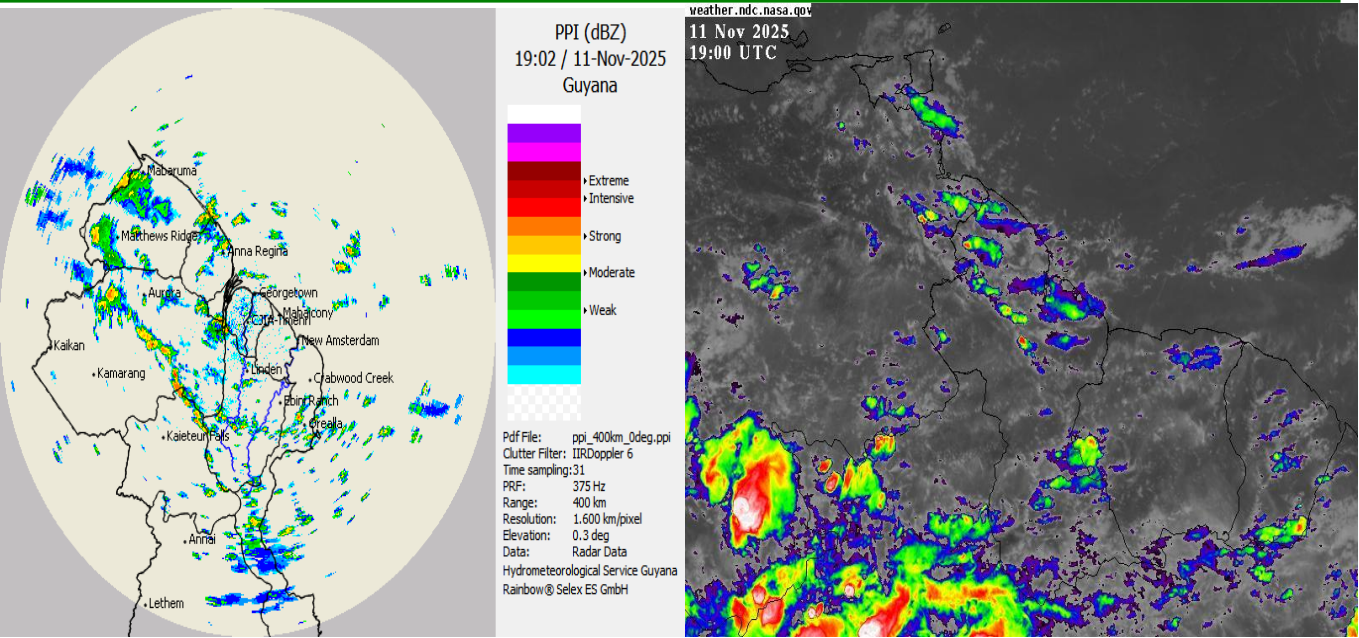
Today's weather review: Cloudy skies with scattered showers were observed over Regions 1, 2, and 6 to 10. Partly cloudy to sunny skies elsewhere.

All remaining regions can expect partly cloudy to fair skies throughout the evening, with cloudy skies accompanied by isolated to scattered showers expected during the early morning. <u>Winds:</u> Gentle to moderate easterly to south-easterly breeze. Strong winds and lightning strikes are possible during thundershowers.	Coastal Regions 3 to 5	 Rainfall between: 5.0 mm and 20.0 mm.	Cloudy skies with isolated to scattered showers and periods of rain can be expected over Coastal Regions 3 to 5 during the morning. Conditions are expected to improve in the afternoon as partly cloudy skies give way to sunny skies. Regions 1, 2, and 6 to 10 can expect cloudy skies with scattered showers, rain, and thundershowers from the morning hours and continue into the afternoon. <u>Winds:</u> Gentle to moderate north-easterly to easterly breeze. Strong winds and lightning strikes are possible during thundershowers.

Extended Forecast

Thursday and Friday: Cloudy skies with isolated to scattered showers of varying intensities, and periods of rain can be expected over Northern Guyana throughout the morning hours. Inland and Hinterland can expect isolated showers and thundershowers during the afternoon. **Rainfall is anticipated to be between 15.0 and 60.0 mm within 24 hours, with the highest expected over Northern Guyana.**

Saturday thru Monday: Cloudy skies with isolated to scattered showers can be expected over Coastal Regions 2 to 6 during the morning hours, with partly cloudy to sunny skies likely to persist from mid-morning. Region 1, Inland and Southern Guyana, can expect cloudy to overcast skies with isolated to scattered showers and thundershowers from the afternoon. ***Rainfall is expected to be between 5.0 and 30.0 mm within 24 hours.***
