WEATHER BRIEF for today Saturday, 15 November 2025, from the Hydrometeorological Service, Guyana

Rainfall records for the past 24 hours, measured at 08:00 hrs Saturday, November 15, 2025, were available for most stations.

Track-F-Bydarabu in Region 7 recorded the highest rainfall of 41.4 mm.

Severe Weather Advisory: In areas of thundershowers, lightning strikes and strong winds can also be expected. Persons should exercise caution when safeguarding life and property.

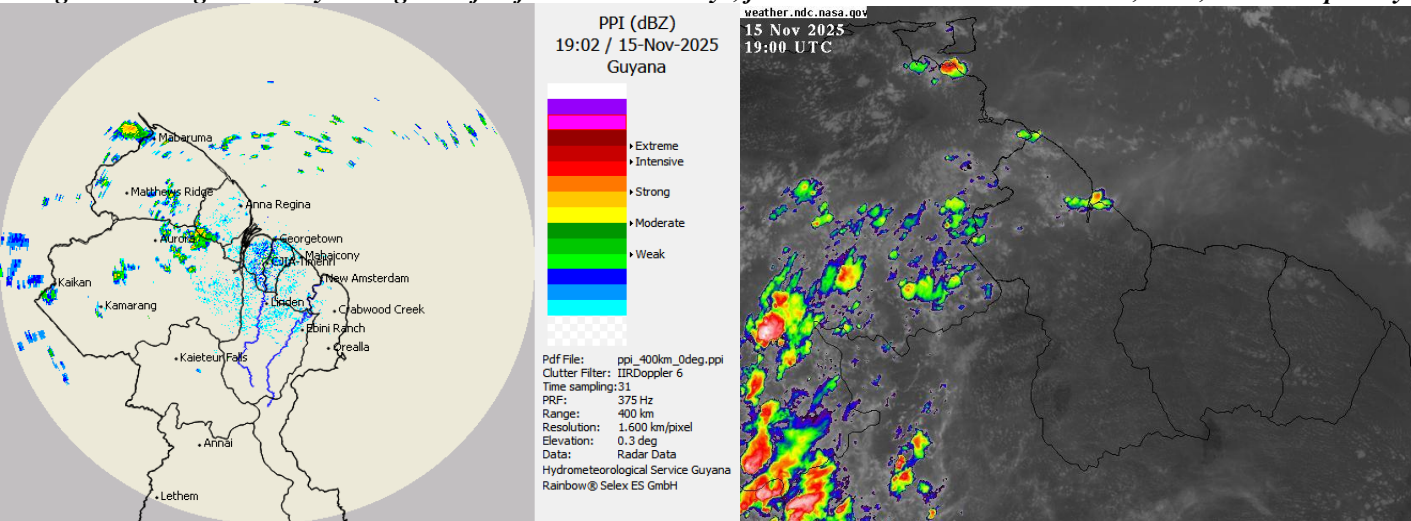
Marine advisory: Residents of low-lying, riverine, and flood-prone areas are advised to take the necessary precautions against flooding as over-topping is likely due to spring tides. In addition, long-period waves can likely result in damage to sea defenses. All marine users, including seagoers, are asked to exercise caution during this time.

Synopsis: *Weak moisture convergence coupled with localized diurnal heating was responsible for mild to moderate instabilities over Region 1, Inland, and parts of Southern Guyana. These conditions are likely to continue into the evening hours. All remaining areas experienced generally stable conditions. This pattern is expected to continue for the next 12 to 48 hours. The forecast area is expected to become unstable from Tuesday and continue into Wednesday.*

Today's weather review: Cloudy skies with isolated showers were observed over Regions 1 and Inland areas along Regions 2 to 4.

SPRING TIDE ADVISORY: CITIZENS ARE ADVISED THAT THE SPRING TIDE ADVISORY COMES INTO EFFECT FROM TOMORROW, NOVEMBER 16, 2025. RESIDENTS OF LOW-LYING, RIVERINE, AND FLOOD-PRONE AREAS ARE ADVISED TO TAKE THE NECESSARY PRECAUTIONS AGAINST FLOODING AS OVER-TOPPING IS LIKELY.

SEA CONDITIONS: SLIGHT TO MODERATE SEAS WITH NORTHERLY SWELLS REACHING HEIGHTS OF 1.0 TO 1.5 METERS IN OPEN WATERS. THESE WAVES ARE LIKELY TO HAVE PERIODS OF 12 AND 13 SECONDS. MODERATE TO FRESH EASTERLY BREEZE.

Extended Forecast

Monday: *Partly cloudy skies with isolated showers can be expected over Coastal Regions 2 to 6 during the morning. Conditions are expected to improve from the afternoon as sunny skies will likely persist. Regions 1, Inland and Southern Guyana can expect cloudy skies with isolated showers and thundershowers from the afternoon. Rainfall is expected to be between 0.0 and 15.0 mm within 24 hours.*

Tuesday through Friday: Cloudy skies becoming overcast at times with scattered showers of varying intensities, and periods of rain can be expected over Regions 1 to 8 and 10. Isolated thundershowers are also likely over Regions 1 to 3, 6, and 7. Conditions are expected to improve over Coastal areas during the afternoon. Region 9 can expect brief periods of cloudiness with passing showers during the afternoon. ***Rainfall is anticipated to be between 25.0 and 75.0 mm over Regions 1 to 8 and 10 and between 0.0 mm and 10.0 mm, within 24 hours.***
