WEATHER BRIEF for today Monday, 24 November 2025, from the Hydrometeorological Service, Guyana

Rainfall records for the past 24 hours, measured at 08:00 hrs Monday, November 24, 2025, were available for most stations.

Fort Island in Region 3 recorded the highest rainfall of 60.7 mm.

***Severe Weather Advisory:* Given that soils may already be saturated from heavy rainfall, and with forecast conditions indicating a strong chance of more rainfall, especially over Regions 1, 2, 3 and 6, which can likely lead to flooding or exacerbate flooding in low-lying areas and areas of poor drainage. Hilly areas can also expect possible mudslides during heavy downpours. In areas of thundershowers, lightning strikes and strong winds can also be expected. Persons should exercise caution when safeguarding life and property.**

***Synopsis:* The ITCZ continues to be the dominant feature of interest over the Northern Guyana, especially over Regions 1,2, and 7. Southern Regions 6, 8, and 9 are also experiencing mild to moderate convection as moisture is being advected in these areas. Elsewhere, isolated pockets of instabilities were and will continue to be experienced. Forecast models are indicating that the ITCZ will likely continue to affect Regions 1, 2, and 7 for the remainder of the week. Mild instabilities will also continue to affect Regions 3 to 6 during the morning hours. Elsewhere, forecast models are indicating generally stable conditions.**

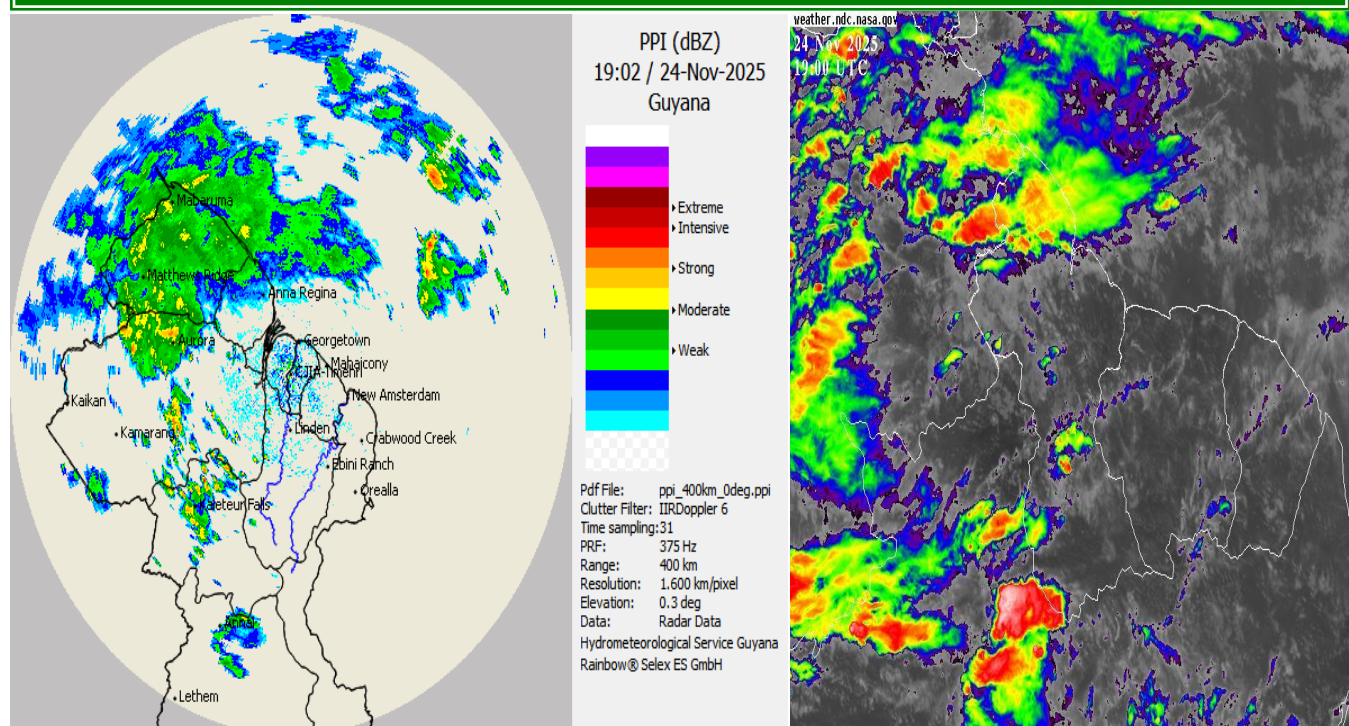
***Today's weather review:* Cloudy to overcast skies with scattered showers and continuous rain were observed over Regions 1, 2, and 7. Elsewhere, partly cloudy to cloudy skies.**

SEA CONDITIONS: SLIGHT TO MODERATE SEAS WITH NORTH TO NORTHEASTERLY SWELLS REACHING HEIGHTS OF 1.5 TO 2.0 METERS IN OPEN WATERS. THESE WAVES ARE LIKELY TO HAVE PERIODS OF 6 AND 7 SECONDS. GENTLE TO MODERATE NORTHEASTERLY TO EASTERLY BREEZE.

Extended Forecast

Wednesday through Sunday: Cloudy skies with isolated to scattered showers can be expected over Coastal Regions 3 to 6 and Region 10 during the morning. Conditions are expected to improve from the afternoon as partly cloudy to sunny skies will likely persist. Regions 1, 2, Inland areas along Regions 3 to 5, Regions 7, and 8 can expect cloudy skies with isolated to scattered showers, rain, and thundershowers. **Rainfall is expected to be between 20.0 and 50.0 mm over Regions 1, 2, Inland areas along Regions 3 to 5, Regions 7 and 8, and between 0.0 mm and 15.0 mm over Coastal Regions 3 to 6 and Region 10, within 24 hours. Region 9 can expect partly cloudy to sunny skies with no significant rainfall.**
