WEATHER BRIEF for today Thursday, 02 October 2025, from the Hydrometeorological Service, Guvana

Rainfall records for the past 24 hours, measured at 08:00 hrs Thursday, October 2, 2025, were available for most stations.

No significant rainfall was recorded.


<u>Severe Weather Advisory</u>: In areas of thundershowers, heavy winds and lightning strikes may be observed. Persons are asked to be alert and exercise caution in efforts to safeguard life and property.

<u>Synopsis:</u> Ridging at the surface coupled with dry mid to upper level is the dominant feature of the forecast area. These features are creating stable conditions. However, localized conditions over the Inland and Hinterland areas produced mild to moderate instabilities over these areas during the afternoon. This pattern is expected to continue for the remainder of the week and into the weekend. The atmosphere is expected to become unstable from Tuesday as an increase in moisture is expected over Northern Guyana, and the ITCZ is re-establishing itself.

Extended Forecast

<u>Saturday and Sunday:</u> Partly cloudy to sunny skies can be expected over Coastal Regions 2 to 6. Region 1, Inland and Southern Guyana, can expect cloudy skies with isolated showers and thundershowers from the afternoon. Rainfall is expected to be between 0.0 and 10.0 mm within 24 hours.

<u>Monday through Wednesday</u>: Cloudy to overcast skies with scattered to frequent showers of varying intensities, continuous rain, and isolated thundershowers can be expected over most of the forecast area. Coastal Guyana can expect these conditions during the morning hours with improvements likely from the afternoon. Rainfall is anticipated to be between 20.0 and 60.0 mm within 24 hours.
