WEATHER BRIEF for today Monday, 27 October 2025, from the Hydrometeorological Service, Guyana

Rainfall records for the past 24 hours, measured at 08:00 hrs Monday, October 27, 2025, were available for most stations.

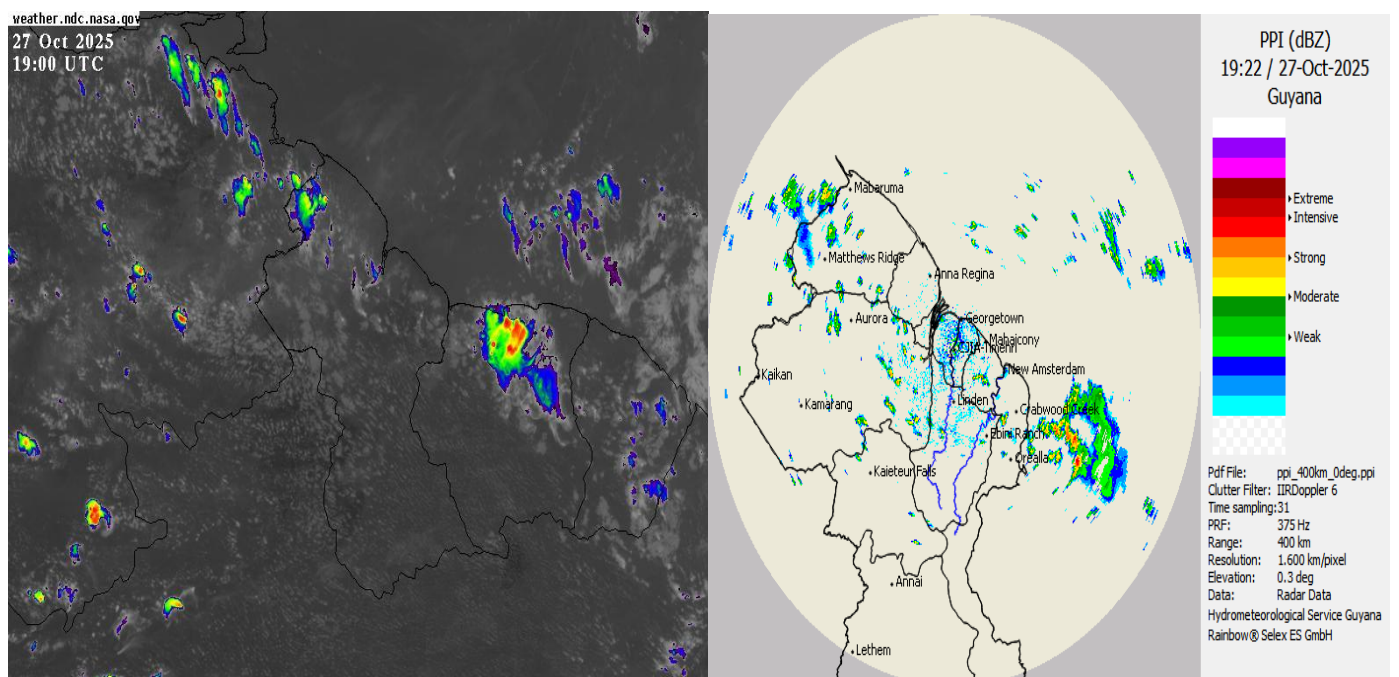
Saxacalli in Region 3 recorded the highest rainfall of 37.7mm.

Synopsis: Mostly stable conditions continued over most of the forecast areas. Ridging throughout the atmosphere was the most significant feature of interest. This pattern is expected to continue for the next 12 hours, with mild to moderate instabilities expected Tomorrow. Localized diurnal heating produced mild instabilities over some Inland areas during the afternoon. Meteorological models are indicating that the forecast area is expected to become unstable from Thursday and continue into the weekend as Tropical waves coupled with the ITCZ are likely to affect the forecast area.

Today's weather review: *Partly cloudy to sunny skies were observed over Regions 2 to 10. Isolated showers were observed over Region 1.*

Extended Forecast

Wednesday and Sunday: Partly cloudy skies with isolated showers can be expected over Coastal Regions 2 to 6 during the morning hours, with partly cloudy to sunny skies likely to persist from mid-morning. Region 1, including Inland and Southern Guyana, can expect cloudy to overcast skies with isolated showers and thundershowers from the afternoon. **Rainfall is expected to be between 0.0 and 15.0 mm within 24 hours.**

Thursday through Saturday: Cloudy to overcast skies with isolated to scattered showers of varying intensities, and intermittent rain can be expected over most of the forecast area.. Inland and Hinterland can expect isolated showers and thundershowers during the afternoon. ***Rainfall is anticipated to be between 5.0 and 35.0 mm.***
