WEATHER BRIEF for today Thursday, 30 October 2025, from the Hydrometeorological Service, Guyana

Rainfall records for the past 24 hours, measured at 08:00 hrs Thursday, October 30, 2025, were available for most stations.

Saxacalli in Region 3 recorded the highest rainfall of 37.7 mm.

Marine advisory: long-period waves can likely result in damage to sea defenses. All marine users including seagoers, are asked to exercise caution during this time.

Synopsis: *A tropical wave coupled with the ITCZ is producing scattered pockets of convection over Northern Guyana. This wave is expected to continue to affect these areas into the evening and early morning hours, with the ITCZ likely to affect areas over Region 6. Mild to moderate instabilities are expected to continue into the weekend, with stable conditions likely to return from Tuesday. Southern Guyana is currently experiencing stable conditions, and this will likely continue into the weekend.*

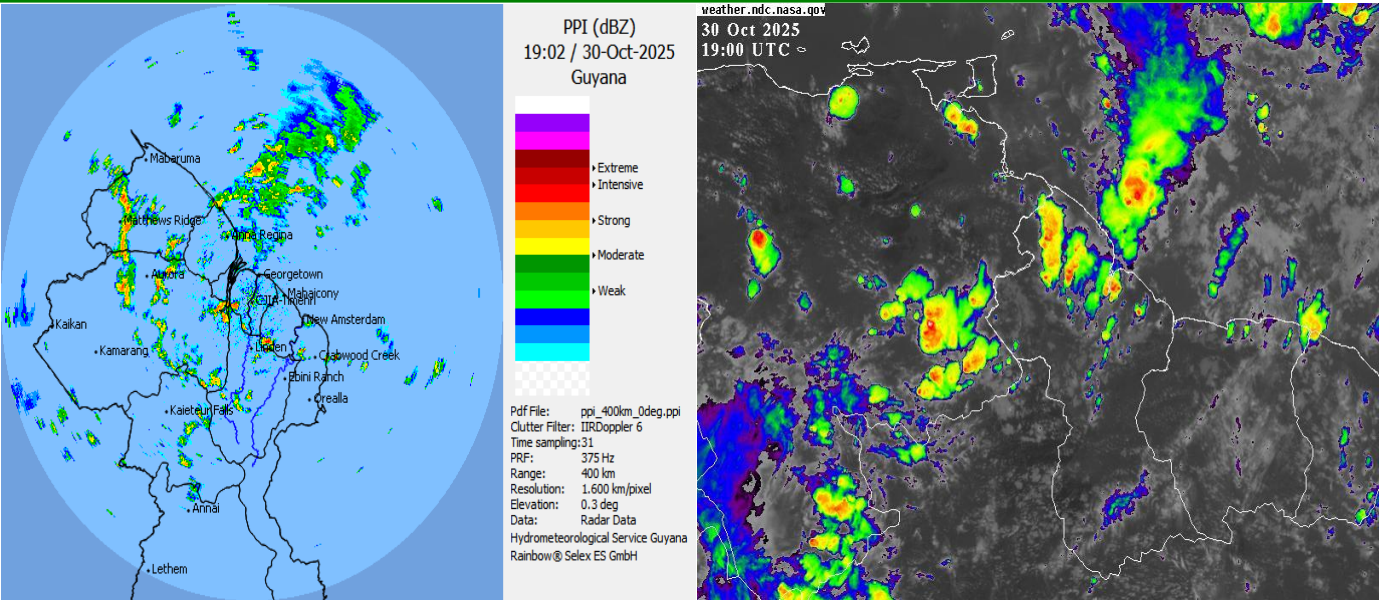
Today's weather review: Cloudy skies with scattered showers were observed over Northern Guyana. Partly cloudy elsewhere.

Strong winds and lightning strikes are possible during thundershowers. <u>Minimum temperatures:</u> Coast: 22 °C – 24 °C Hinterland: 19 °C – 22 °C	Coastal Guyana	 Rainfall between: 5.0 mm and 20.0 mm. All remaining areas can expect fair skies during the morning, with cloudy skies with isolated showers and thundershowers likely to be experienced from the afternoon. <u>Winds:</u> Moderate to fresh easterly to south-easterly breeze. Strong winds and lightning strikes are possible during thundershowers. <u>Maximum temperatures:</u> Coast: 30 °C – 32 °C Hinterland: 33 °C – 35 °C

Extended Forecast

Saturday, Sunday, Tuesday, and Wednesday: Partly cloudy skies with isolated showers can be expected over Coastal Regions 2 to 6 during the morning hours, with partly cloudy to sunny skies likely to persist from mid-morning. Region 1, including Inland and Southern Guyana, can expect cloudy to overcast skies with isolated showers and thundershowers from the afternoon. **Rainfall is expected to be between 0.0 and 15.0 mm within 24 hours.**

Monday: Cloudy to overcast skies with isolated to scattered showers of varying intensities, and intermittent rain can be expected over most of the forecast area.. Inland and Hinterland can expect isolated showers and thundershowers during the afternoon. **Rainfall is anticipated to be between 5.0 and 35.0 mm.**
