Weather Brief for Saturday, 03 January 2026 from the Hydrometeorological Service, Guyana.

Rainfall records for the past 24 hours, measured at 08:00hrs Saturday, 03 January 2026 were available for most of the stations. **Friendship, EBD recorded the highest rainfall of 34.0mm.**


Synopsis: Weak instabilities within shallow moisture plumes are oscillating across Guyana.

Today's weather review: Mix of sunshine and clouds with isolated showers.

SPRING TIDE ADVISORY: Persons are reminded that the Spring tide advisory remains effective until Thursday, January 8, 2026.

Sea conditions:

Slight to moderate in open waters with waves reaching 1.5 to 2.0 meters (3 to 5 ft) and increasing.

- These waves will likely have periods of 6 and 7 seconds
- Gentle northeasterly to easterly breeze.

Extended Forecast

Monday and Tuesday: Partly cloudy to cloudy skies can be expected across Guyana with brief to scattered showers. **Rainfall is anticipated to be less than 15 mm.**

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Wednesday to Friday: mostly cloudy skies can be expected with intermittent showers. Rainfall is expected to be between 20 and 40 mm within 24 hours of accumulation.
