

Weather Brief for Sunday, 05 July 2026 from the Hydrometeorological Service, Guyana

Rainfall records for the past 24 hours, measured at 08:00hrs Sunday, 05 July 2026 were available for most of the stations. Imbaimadai in Region 7 recorded the highest rainfall of 90.0 mm.

Severe Weather Advisory: Areas affected by thundershowers may experience strong wind gusts, heavy rainfall, and possible lightning strikes. Residents are advised to exercise caution during these conditions.

Synopsis: Low-level convergence and trough, enhanced by the ITCZ, produced instabilities over the forecast area. Similar atmospheric conditions are projected for the next two days, after which a tropical wave is expected to affect the forecast area with widespread instabilities.

Today’s weather review: Regions 1 to northern 6 observed cloudy skies with light to moderate showers and rain in the morning, becoming partly cloudy and sunny in the afternoon. Elsewhere, mostly cloudy skies with intermittent rain and scattered thundershowers.

The long-term daily average rainfall for Georgetown for the next 10 days, July 06 to 15, 2026, is 10.6 mm per day.

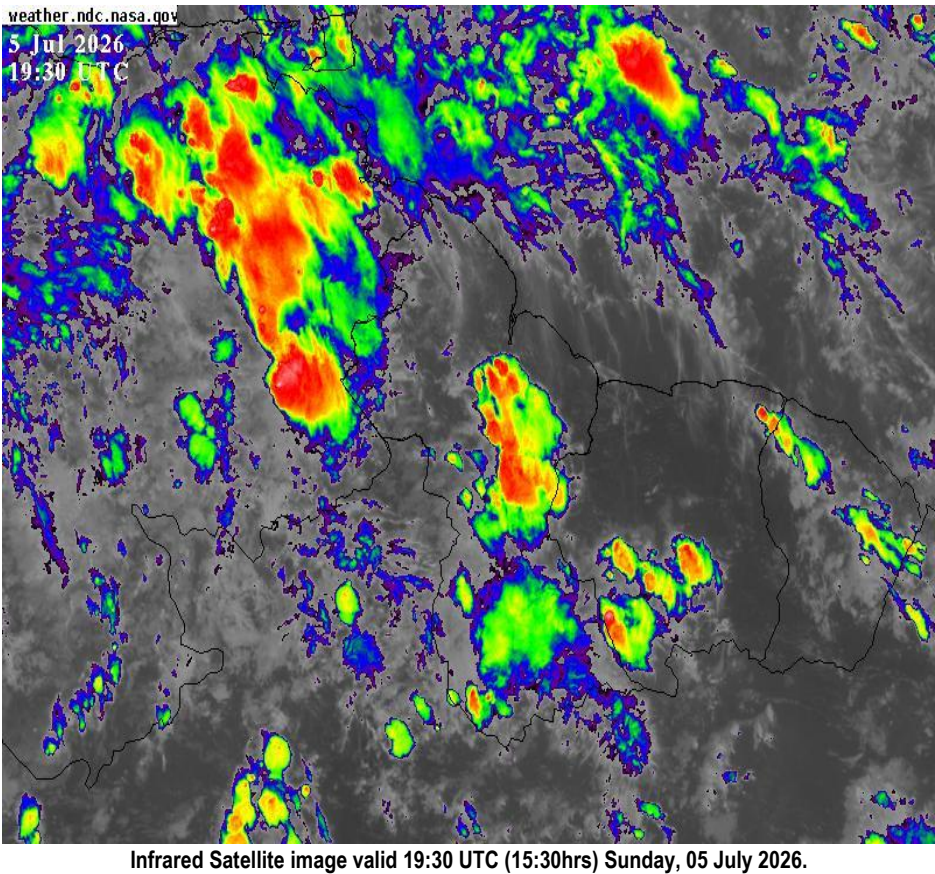

Spring Tide Advisory: The Spring Tide is not in effect.

Sea conditions:

- Slight to moderate northeasterly seas with swells reaching 1.5 to 2.0 meters in open waters.
- These waves will likely have periods of between 7 and 8 seconds.
- Moderate easterly breeze.

Extended Forecast

Tuesday: Mostly cloudy skies with intermittent rain and scattered thundershowers over regions 1 and 6 to 10. Elsewhere, morning cloudy skies with occasional showers, becoming mostly sunny in the afternoon. Rainfall is expected to be between 20 mm and 50 mm over regions 1 and 6 to 10, elsewhere between 5 mm and 20 mm within 24 hours.

Wednesday and Friday: Cloudy to overcast skies with intermittent rain and isolated thundershowers. Rainfall is expected to be between 30 mm and 70 mm within 24 hours.

Thursday and Saturday: Partly cloudy and sunny skies with brief showers and isolated thundershowers in the afternoon. Rainfall is expected to be between 0 mm and 15 mm within 24 hours.
