WEATHER BRIEF for Tuesday 07 July 2026, from the Hydrometeorological Service, Guyana-
Rainfall records for the past 24 hours, measured at 08:00 hours on Tuesday, 07 July 2026, were available for some stations. Mara in Region 6 recorded the highest rainfall of 81.2mm
Synopsis: Tropical Wave(Tw) axis over North Guyana, interacting with the Inter-Tropical Convergence Zone (ITCZ), has generated an unstable atmosphere mostly over Regions 1 to 5. 7 and 10. After the passage of the Tropical wave, moisture plumes from the Intertropical Convergence Zone (ITCZ) are expected to generate weak to moderate instability until the arrival of the other Tropical Wave in the next 24 to 36 hours.
Weather review: Cloudy to overcast skies with occasional to frequent showers, intermittent rain, and thundershowers over Regions 1 to 5, 7, and 10. Elsewhere, partly cloudy and sunny skies with no significant rainfall.

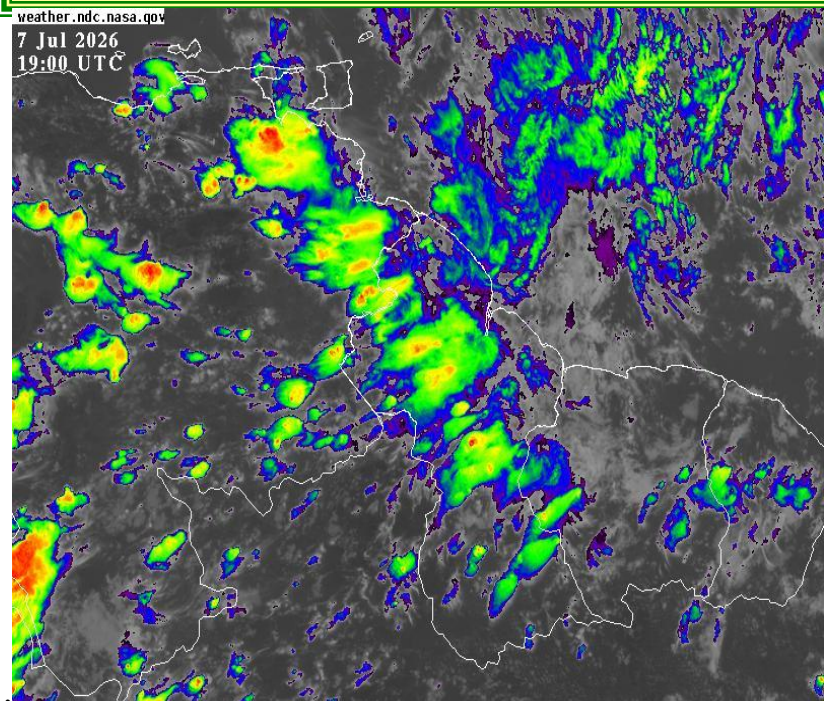

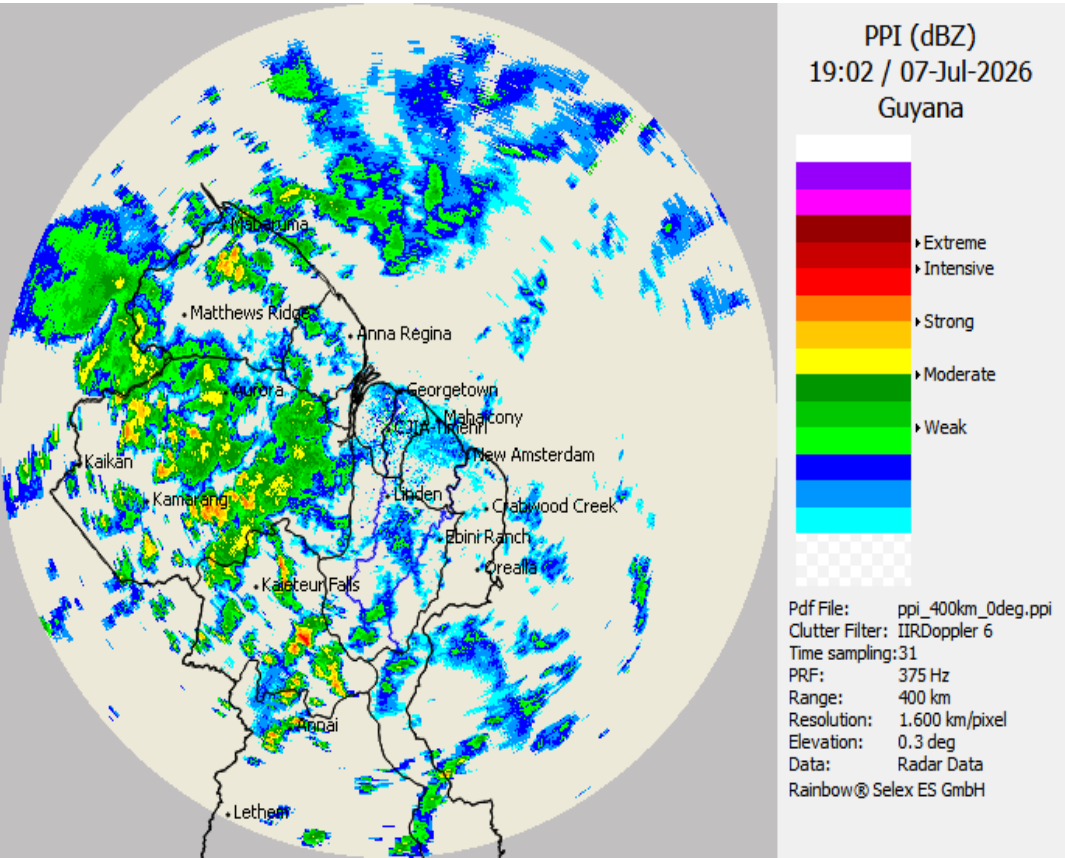
Georgetown's long-term daily average rainfall for the next 10 days, 07 July to 16 July 2026, is 10.7mm per day.

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SEA CONDITIONS: Moderate in open waters with North-easterly swells reaching 1.0 to 2.0 meters (3 to 6ft) and increasing.,

These waves will likely have periods of 7 and 8 seconds,

Winds: Light to Gentle Northeast breeze.

Thursday: Partly cloudy to cloudy skies with frequent showers over Regions 1 to 5 and North Region 6, thundershowers are likely. In the other Regions no significant rainfall. **Rainfall is expected to range between 0 and 40mm.**

Friday: Partly cloudy to cloudy skies with occasional to frequent showers over Regions 1 to 4 and 7. Elsewhere, scattered showers. **Rainfall is expected to range between 15 and 30mm.**

Saturday: Early morning showers over Region 1. In the other Regions, no significant rainfall. For the remainder of the forecast period, mostly sunny skies are expected to dominate. **Rainfall is expected to range between 0 and 15mm.**

Sunday and Monday: Mostly fair and sunny skies are expected to be interrupted by periods of cloudiness with scattered showers over all Regions. **Rainfall is expected to range between 5 and 15mm.**
