

Weather Brief for Thursday, 09 July 2026 from the Hydrometeorological Service, Guyana

Rainfall records for the past 24 hours, measured at 08:00hrs Thursday, 09 July 2026 were available for most of the stations. **Saxacalli in Region 3 recorded the highest rainfall of 48.2 mm.**

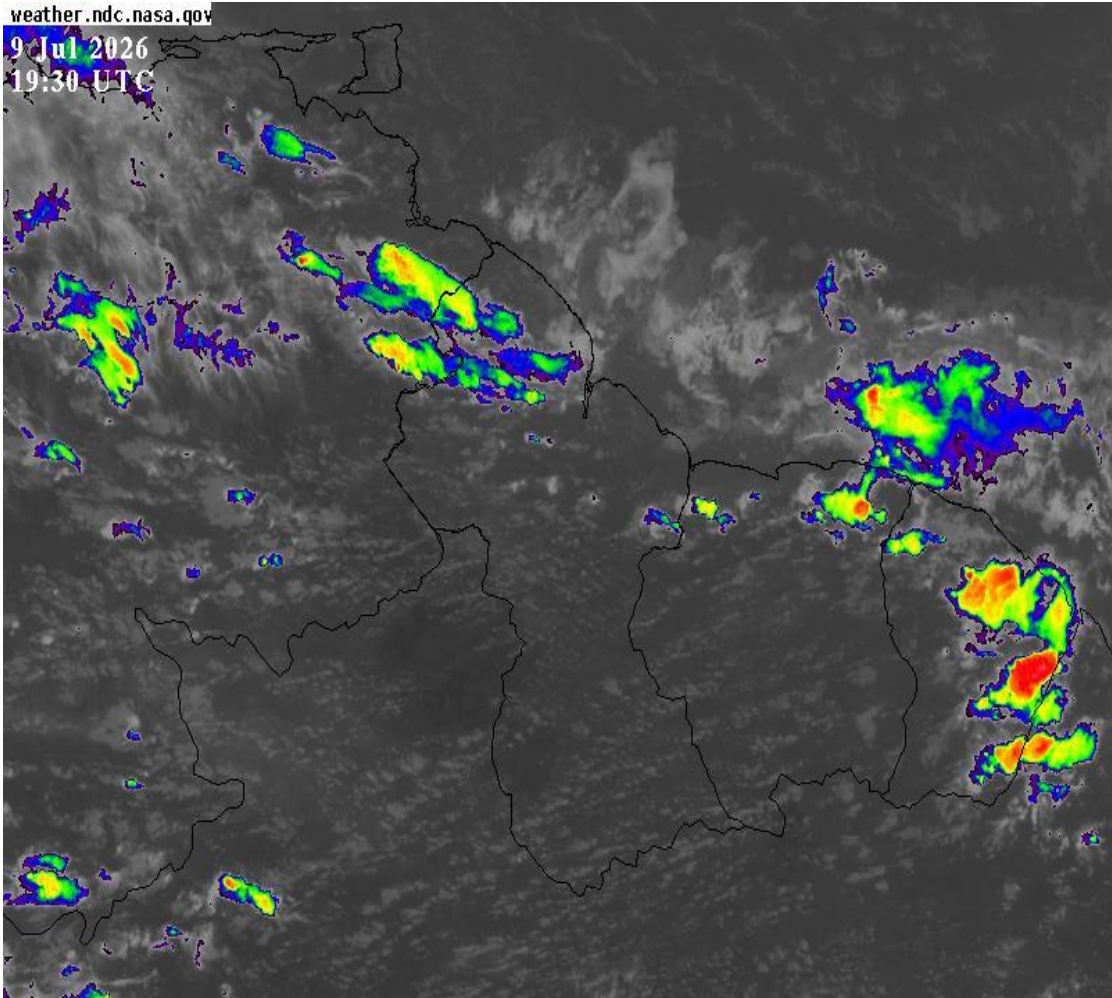
Synopsis: Trade wind convergence with localized conditions produced weak isolated pockets of instability over the forecast area. Tomorrow, a tropical wave (#25) is projected to produce widespread instabilities with more impact over northern regions of the country.

Today’s weather review: Partly cloudy and sunny skies with isolated thundershowers and showers were observed.

- Moderate northeasterly seas with swells reaching 1.5 to 2.0 meters in open waters.
- These waves will likely have periods of between 7 and 8 seconds.
- Moderate easterly breeze.

Extended Forecast

Saturday through Wednesday: Morning brief showers over coastal regions becoming mostly fair and sunny afterwards. Elsewhere, partly cloudy and sunny skies with isolated afternoon thundershowers and showers. Rainfall is expected to be between 0 mm and 15 mm within 24 hours.
