Weather Brief for Friday, 11 July 2025 from the Hydrometeorological Service, Guyana.



Rainfall records for the past 24 hours, measured at 08:00hrs Friday, 11 July 2025 were available for most of the stations.

Kwakwani in Region 10 recorded the highest rainfall of 50.6 mm

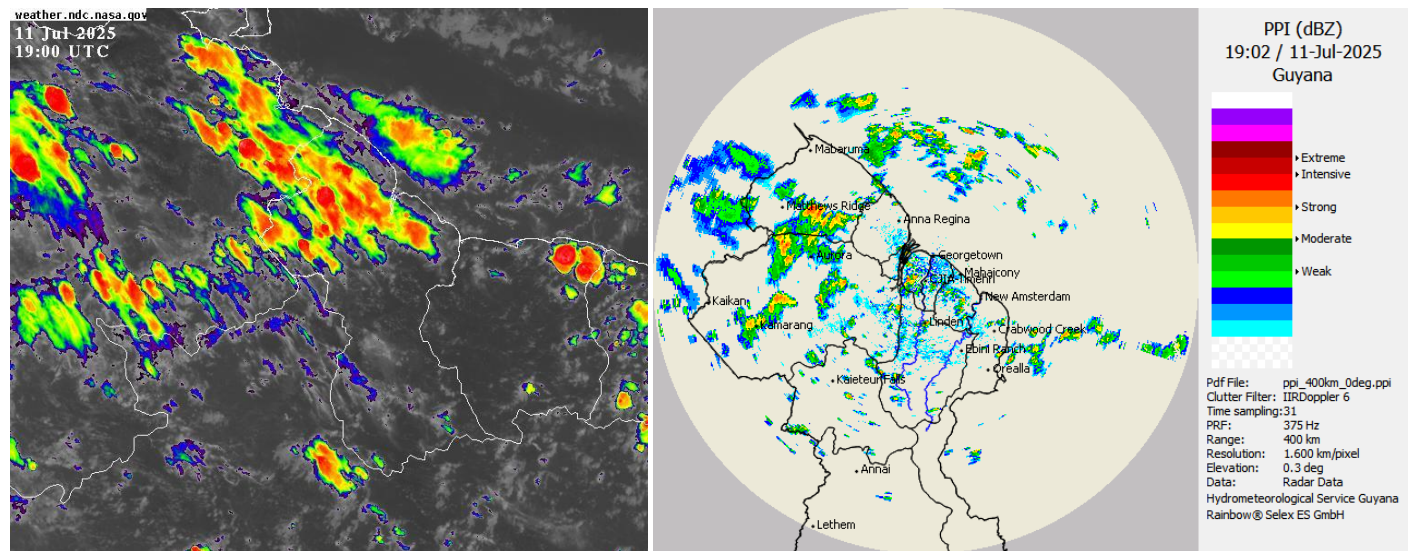
Synopsis: Scattered moderate to deep instabilities embedded within deep moisture plumes from the ITCZ are affecting most of northern Guyana. Over southern Guyana, oscillations of a low-level trough were observed during the morning. These patterns are expected to continue throughout the weekend.

Today's weather review: Cloudy skies were observed throughout Guyana with occasional showers and scattered thundershowers over Regions 1 to 4 and 7. All other areas saw scattered showers.

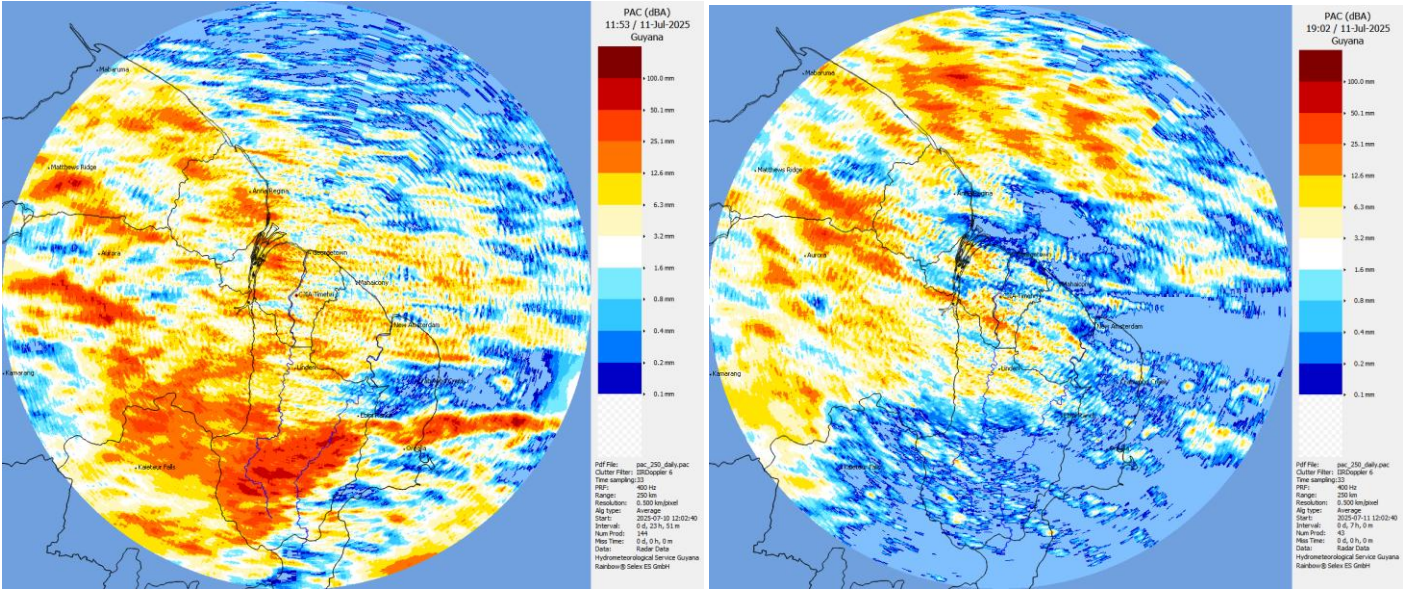
The long-term daily average rainfall for Georgetown, for the next 10 days July 12, 2025 to July 21, 2025 is 8.5mm per day.

SPRING TIDE ADVISORY: Persons are advised that the spring tide advisory is in effect. Spring tides coupled with high waves may lead to overtopping of the river and sea defence vulnerable areas. All necessary precautions should be taken.

Sea conditions:

Moderate in open waters with northeasterly swells reaching 1.5 to 2.5 meters (5 to 7 ft).

- These waves will likely have periods of between 8 and 9 seconds.
- Moderate northeast to easterly breeze.

Extended Forecast

Saturday: Cloudy skies with occasional showers can be expected during the morning over coastal areas. In the early afternoon, southern regions 6 and 9 will see scattered showers and thundershowers. Rainfall is expected between 10 and 25 mm.

Sunday, apart from early morning showers and thundershowers over regions 6, 9, and 10, partly cloudy to cloudy skies can be expected across Guyana. Rainfall is anticipated between 10 and 20 mm over regions 6, 9, and 10, and elsewhere, no significant rainfall is expected.

Monday, cloudy skies with occasional showers and isolated thundershowers in the afternoon. Rainfall is anticipated between 10 and 25 mm.

Tuesday to Thursday, mostly cloudy to occasionally overcast skies can be expected with intermittent to frequent showers and rain. Thundershowers are likely in the early morning and mid-afternoon. Rainfall is anticipated between 30 and 70 mm within 24 hours of accumulation.
