WEATHER BRIEF for Saturday 11 July 2026, from the Hydrometeorological Service, Guyana

Rainfall records for the past 24 hours, measured at 08:00 hours on Saturday, 11 July 2026, were available for some stations. Ituni in Region 10 recorded the highest rainfall of 63.0mm

Synopsis: Pockets of moisture from the Intertropical Convergence Zone. (ITCZ), is inducing a weak low to mid-level trough and atmospheric instability over the forecast area.

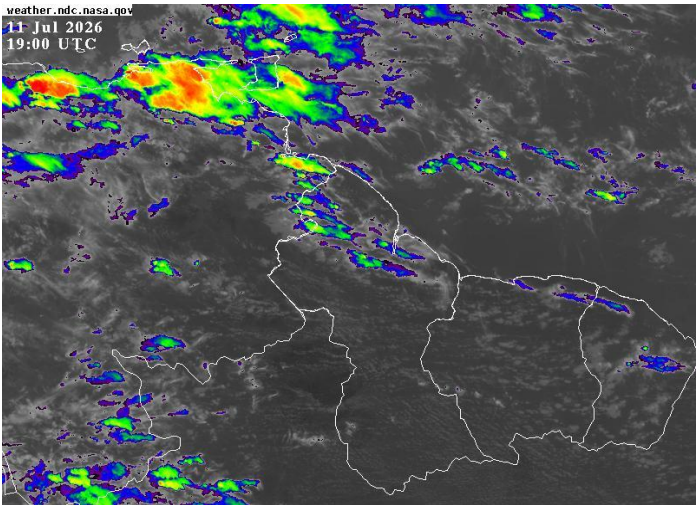
Weather review: Partly cloudy to cloudy skies with scattered showers and thundershowers over inland areas. Elsewhere, no significant rainfall.

Georgetown's long-term daily average rainfall for the next 10 days, 11 July to 20 July 2026, is 10.1mm per day.

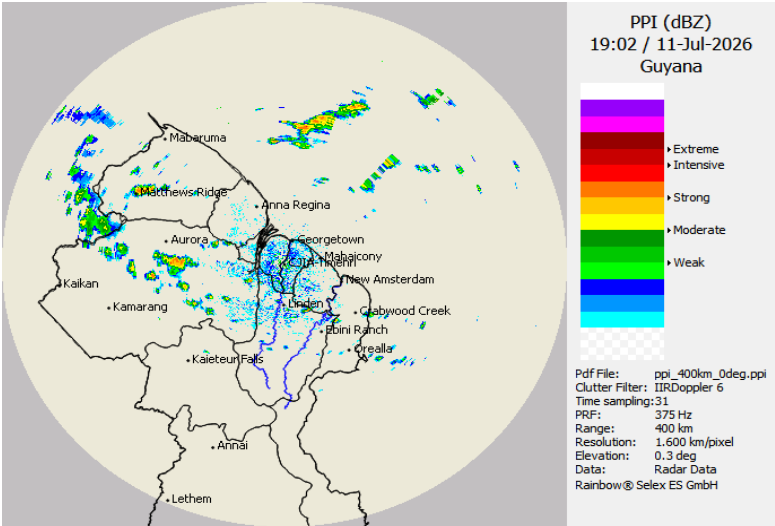

Monday: Partly cloudy to cloudy skies with scattered to occasional showers in Regions 1 to 5, 10, North and South Region 6. In the other areas, scattered showers **Rainfall is expected to range between 5 and 30mm.**

Tuesday through Friday: Partly cloudy to cloudy skies with scattered showers over coastal areas in the morning and other areas in the remainder of the forecast period. **Rainfall is expected to range between 0 and 15mm.**
