Weather Brief for Tuesday, 14 July 2026 from the Hydrometeorological Service, Guyana.

Rainfall records for the past 24 hours, measured at 08:00hrs available for most of the stations.

De Kinderen Back in Region 3 recorded the highest rainfall of 29.0 mm

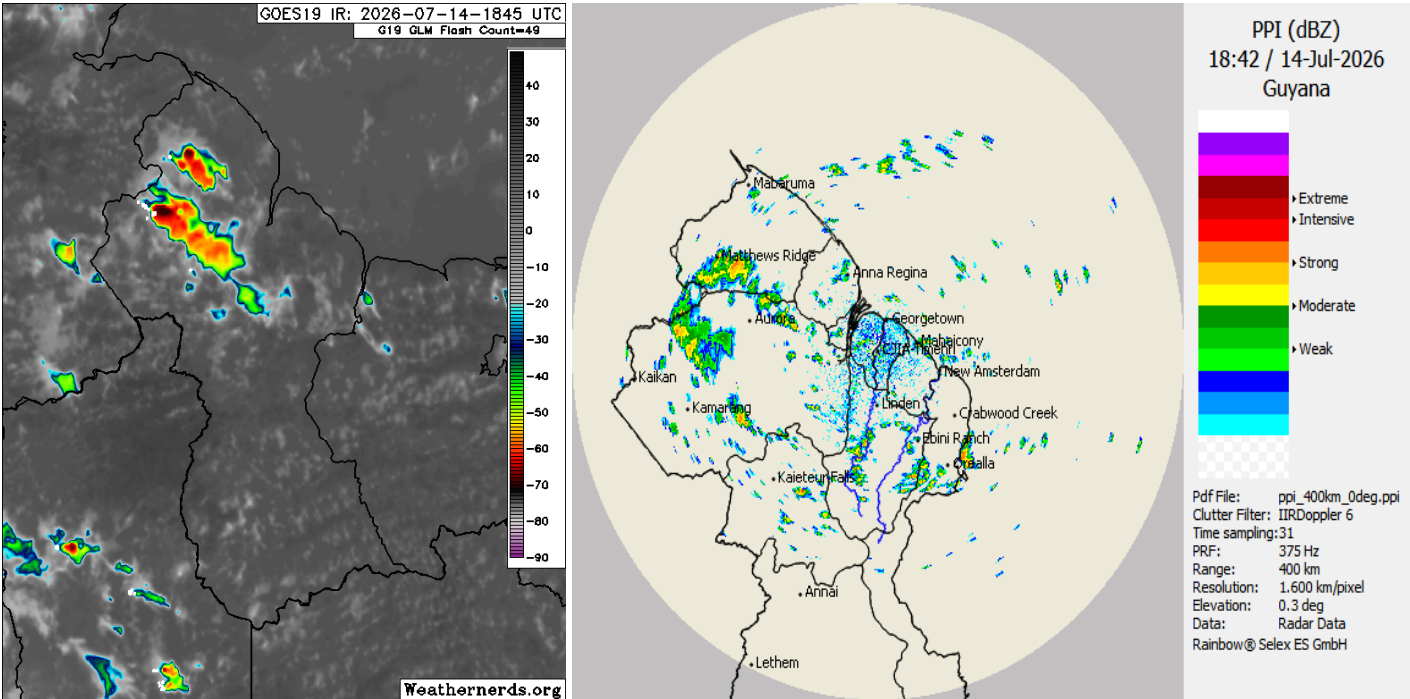
Synopsis: A high-pressure ridge remains the dominant weather feature affecting Guyana. However, localized atmospheric instabilities have resulted in isolated convective development across some areas. This pattern is expected to persist throughout the week, bringing generally fair conditions with occasional localized showers and thunderstorms. By the weekend, conditions are forecast to become wetter as the Intertropical Convergence Zone (ITCZ) gradually regenerates and becomes established across northern Guyana. This is expected to increase moisture and instability, leading to more frequent showers and thunderstorms across parts of the country.

Today's weather review: Generally sunny skies were observed across Guyana with isolated to scattered showers and thunderstorms over inland Guyana.

Sea conditions:

Open waters are expected to be gentle to moderate with northeast to easterly waves reaching 1.5 to 2.0 meters (4 to 6 feet) and steady.

- Wave periods will range between 6 and 8 seconds.
- Gentle to moderate northeast to easterly breeze.

Extended Forecast

Thursday and Friday: Partly cloudy to cloudy skies can be expected with brief localised showers and isolated thunderstorms. **Rainfall is expected to be less than 15 mm.**

Saturday and Sunday: Cloudy to overcast skies with intermittent to frequent showers and isolated thunderstorms across northern Guyana. Southern Guyana will see a mix of sunshine and clouds with scattered showers. **Rainfall is anticipated to be between 30 to 70 mm over northern Guyana and between 5 and 15 mm elsewhere.**
