Weather Brief for Friday, 17 July 2026 from the Hydrometeorological Service, Guyana.

Rainfall records for the past 24 hours, measured at 08:00hrs available for most of the stations.

Matthews Ridge in Region 1 recorded the highest rainfall of 60.0 mm

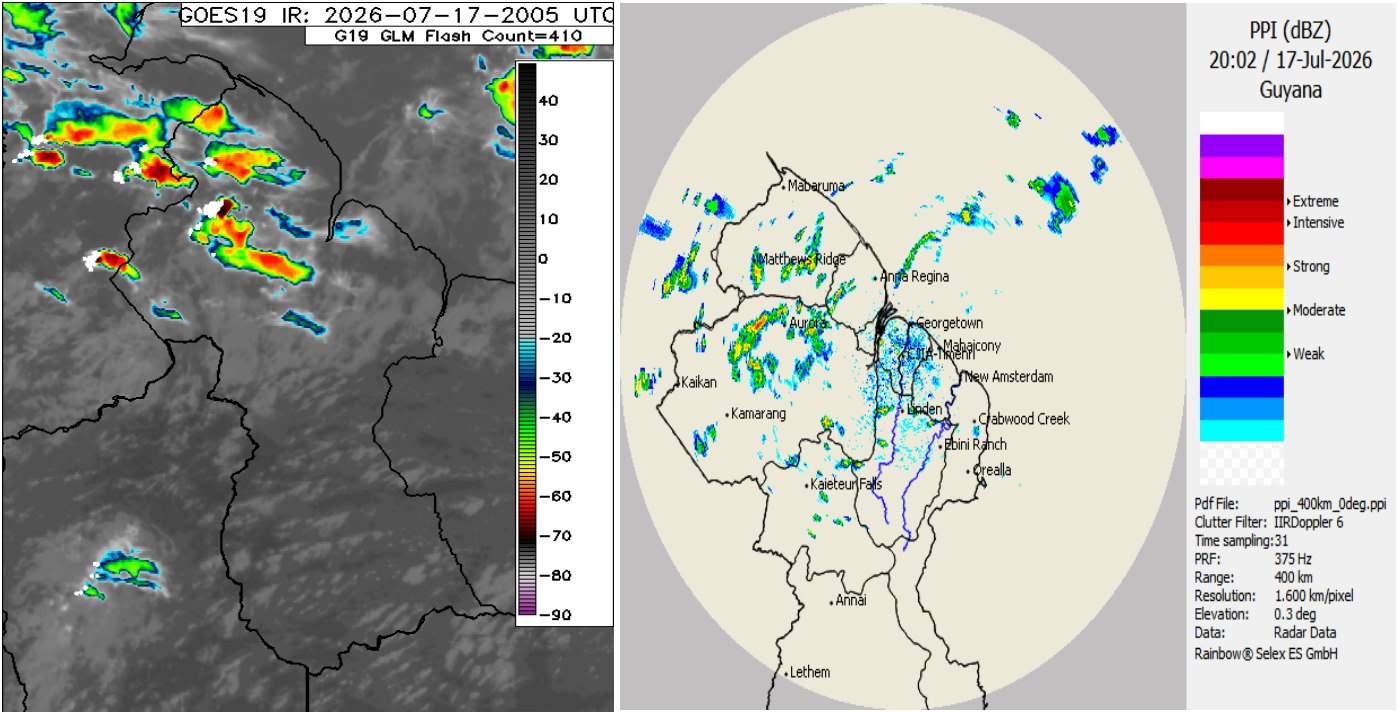
Synopsis: Weak atmospheric instabilities embedded within shallow moisture plumes associated with the ITCZ are currently influencing weather conditions across Guyana. This pattern is expected to persist into the new week, with an increase in showers anticipated on Sunday during the morning.

Today's weather review: a mix of sunshine and clouds with scattered to occasional showers was observed across Guyana.

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SPRING TIDE ADVISORY: Persons are reminded that the Spring Tide Advisory remains effective until Sunday, July 19, 2026.

Sea conditions:

Open waters are expected to be gentle to moderate with northeasterly waves reaching 2.0 to 2.5 meters (6 to 8 feet) and steady.

- Wave periods will range between 7 and 8 seconds.
- Gentle to moderate easterly breeze.

Extended Forecast

Sunday and Thursday: cloudy to overcast skies can be expected across Guyana with intermittent to frequent showers during the morning. Rainfall is expected between 20 and 50 mm, highest over regions 1 and 2.

Monday to Wednesday and Friday: Mix of sunshine and clouds with isolated to scattered showers. Rainfall is expected to be less than 20 mm.
