WEATHER BRIEF for Sunday 19 July 2026, from the Hydrometeorological Service, Guyana

Rainfall records for the past 24 hours, measured at 08:00 hours on Sunday, 19 July 2026, were available for some stations. 47 miles Mabura in Region 10 recorded the highest rainfall of 32.4mm

Synopsis: The Intertropical Convergence Zone (ITCZ), and Saharan Air Layer (SAL) are the synoptic feature currently affecting Guyana. thus, generating weak to moderate Instability over coastal Guyana. In the other areas, mostly stable condition. This feature will continue for the remainder of the week.

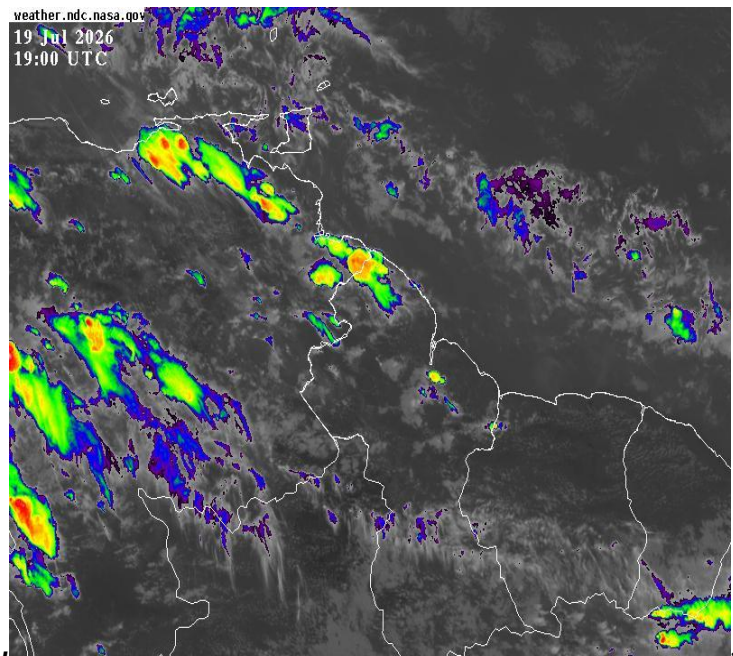
Weather review: Partly cloudy to cloudy skies with scattered showers over hilly and sandy districts.

Georgetown's long-term daily average rainfall for the next 10 days, 19 July to 28 July 2026, is 7.8mm per day.

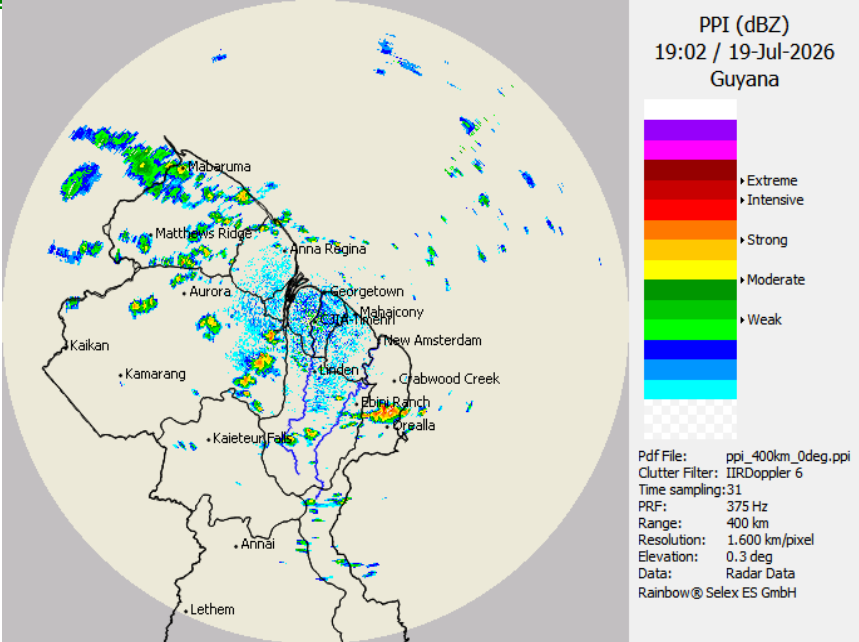

Wednesday through Saturday: Mostly fair and sunny skies are expected to be interrupted by periods of cloudiness with scattered showers along coastal areas in the morning and other areas, for the remainder of the forecast period. **Rainfall is expected to range between 0 and 10mm**
