Severe Weather Advisory: Areas affected by thundershowers will experience strong wind gusts, brief periods of intense rainfall, and possible lightning strikes. Residents are advised to exercise caution during these conditions.

Weather Brief for Thursday, 02 July 2026 from the Hydrometeorological Service, Guyana.

Rainfall records for the past 24 hours, measured at 08:00hrs available for most of the stations.

Mibicuri in Region 6 recorded the highest rainfall of 84.2 mm

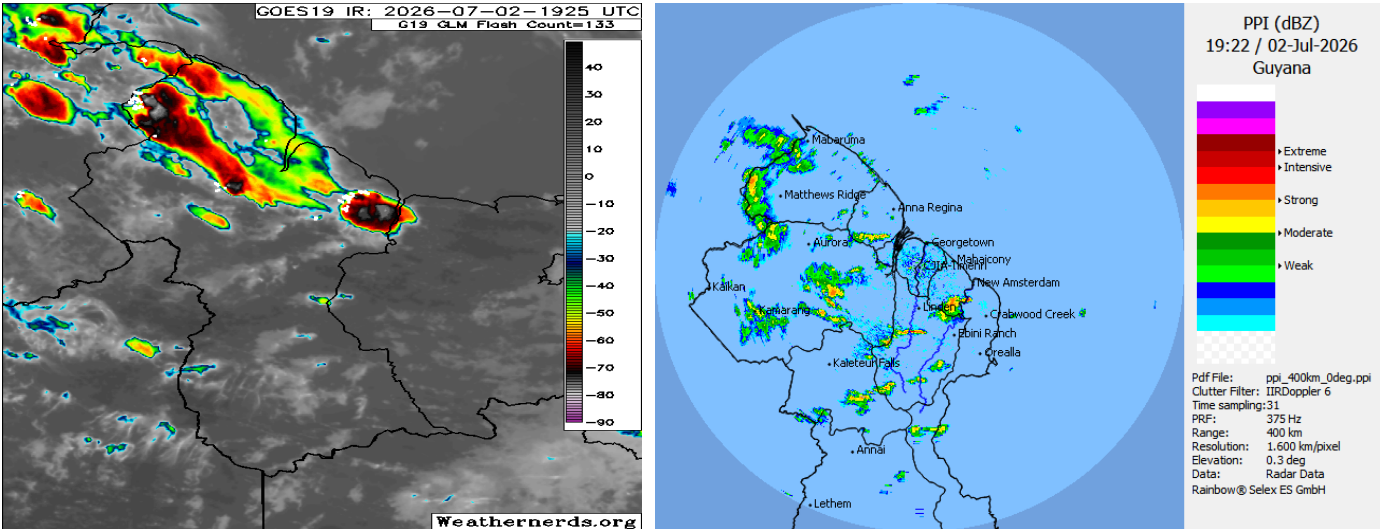
Synopsis: Mildly unstable atmospheric conditions ahead of a tropical wave, enhanced by strong low-level surface convergence and localized daytime heating, are affecting Guyana. Forecast models indicate sufficient shallow to moderate moisture along the wave axis to support scattered showers and isolated thunderstorms, particularly in areas where local conditions enhance convection. As the tropical wave moves away, fluctuations in the Inter-Tropical Convergence Zone (ITCZ) are expected to become the dominant weather feature, bringing continued periods of cloudiness, showers, and isolated thunderstorms across Guyana.

Today's weather review: Occasionally cloudy skies were observed across Guyana with scattered showers and thunderstorms.

Sea conditions:

Open waters are expected to be gentle to moderate with northeast waves reaching 1.5 to 2.5 meters (4 to 6 feet) and increasing.

- Wave periods will range between 7 and 8 seconds.
- Gentle to moderate easterly breeze.

Extended Forecast

Saturday and Sunday: Cloudy to overcast skies with frequent showers and intermittent rain. Thunderstorms can be expected between mid-morning and mid-afternoon. **Rainfall is anticipated to be between 30 and 50 mm within 24 hours of accumulation.**

Monday to Wednesday: Partly cloudy to cloudy skies can be expected throughout Guyana with scattered showers. Rainfall is expected to be between 0 and 20 mm.
