Weather Brief for Monday, 20 July 2026 from the Hydrometeorological Service, Guyana.

Rainfall records for the past 24 hours, measured at 08:00hrs available for most of the stations.

Kumaka in Region 1 recorded the highest rainfall of 62.0mm

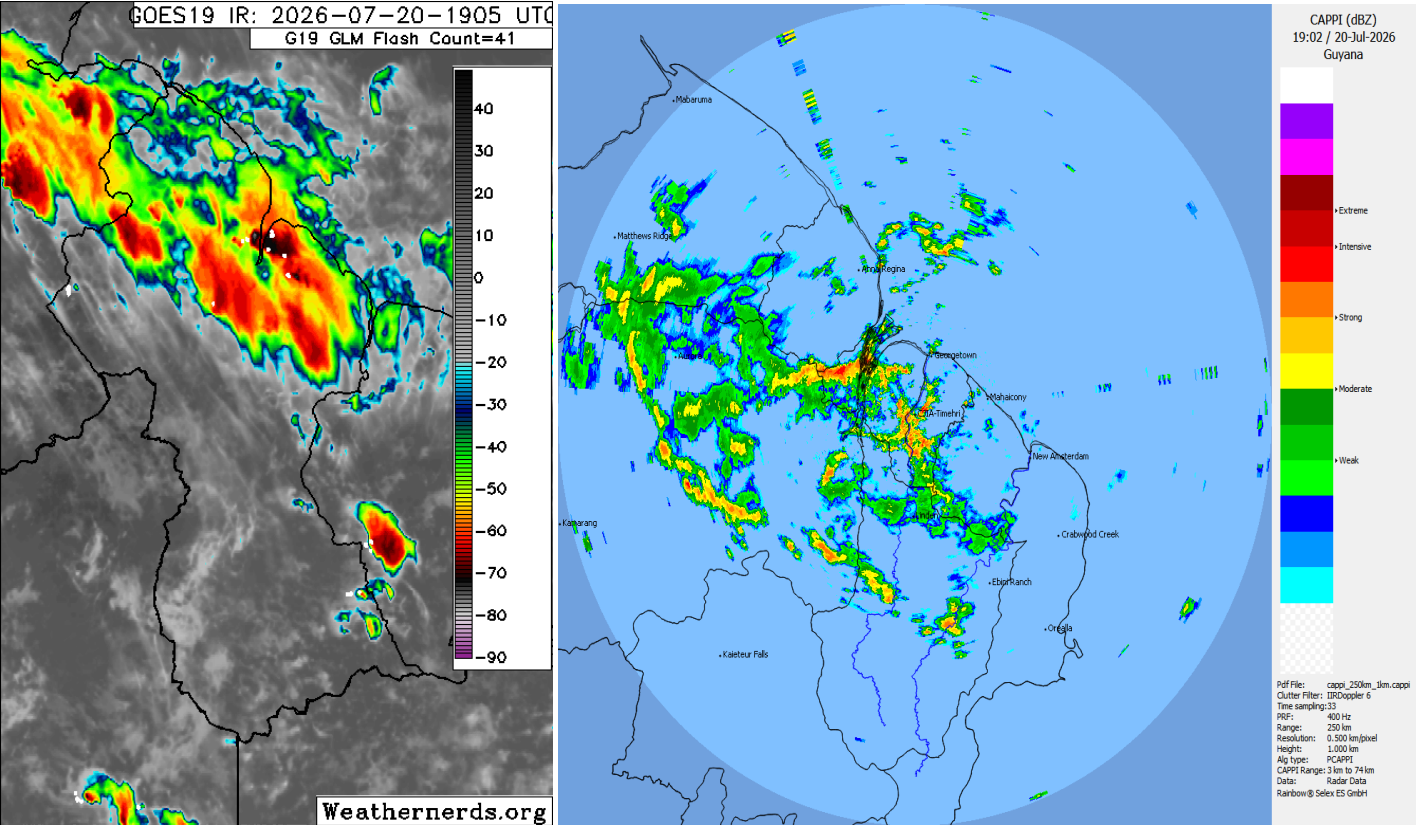
Synopsis: The Intertropical Convergence Zone (ITCZ) remains the primary synoptic feature influencing Guyana and is forecast to persist throughout the week. Periods of reduced convective activity are expected as the ITCZ undergoes its natural oscillation. Overnight and early morning atmospheric instability will continue to favour the development of deep convection, particularly across northern Guyana, on most days. Convective activity is expected to gradually weaken through the late morning and afternoon.

Today's weather review: Mostly cloudy skies with occasional showers and scattered thunderstorms was observed over coastal and inland areas. All other areas experienced cloudy skies with early to mid-morning scattered showers.

Sea conditions:

Open waters are expected to be moderate with northeasterly waves reaching 1.5 to 2.0 meters (3 to 5 feet) and steady.

- Wave periods will range between 6 and 7 seconds.
- Moderate northeast to easterly breeze.

Extended Forecast

Wednesday: A mix of sunshine and clouds with isolated showers. **No significant rainfall is likely.**

Thursday: Overnight into early morning thundershowers over coastal areas. Afternoon cloudy to overcast skies with frequent showers and intermittent rain with thunderstorms. **Rainfall is anticipated to be between 20 and 50 mm, highest over regions 1, 6 and 10.**

Friday, cloudy skies with intermittent to frequent showers and isolated thunderstorms across northern Guyana. Southern Guyana will see sunny skies with a few localised showers. **Rainfall is expected to be between 10 and 30 mm.**

Saturday, overnight scattered showers over regions 7 to 9, elsewhere mostly fair skies can be expected. Rainfall is expected to be between 0 and 15 mm.

Sunday, morning frequent showers, afternoon, fair and sunny skies. Rainfall between 20 and 40 mm.
