

Weather Brief for Tuesday, 21 July 2026 from the Hydrometeorological Service, Guyana

Rainfall records for the past 24 hours, measured at 08:00hrs Tuesday, 21 July 2026 were available for most of the stations. **Saxacalli in Region 3 recorded the highest rainfall of 90.0 mm.**

Synopsis: Localized conditions, weak troughs with interaction from ITCZ and Upper-level Jet produced instabilities over northern regions of the country. Elsewhere subsidence and ridging dominated. Similar atmospheric conditions projected for next 2 to 5 days.

Today’s weather review: Southern regions 6 and 9 observed mostly fair and sunny skies; elsewhere, partly cloudy skies with frequent showers and isolated thundershowers.

The long-term daily average rainfall for Georgetown for the next 10 days, July 22 to August 05, 2026, is 7.6 mm per day.

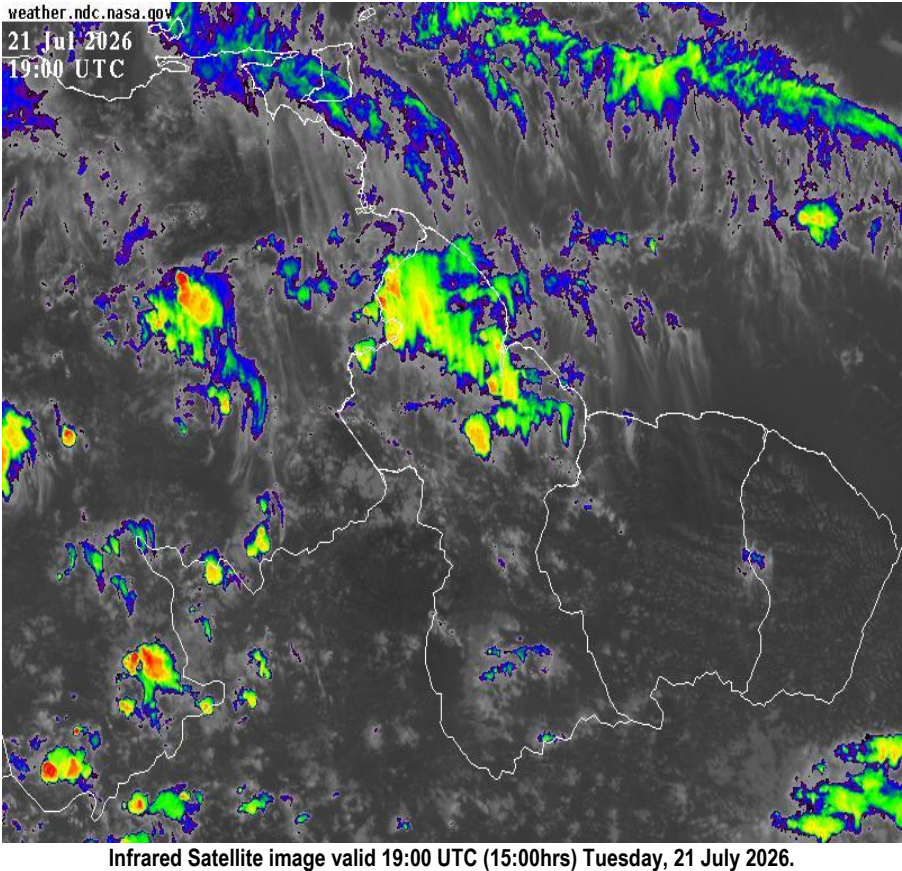

Sea conditions:

- Slight northeasterly seas with swells reaching 1.0 to 1.5 meters in open waters.
- These waves will likely have periods of between 5 and 7 seconds.
- Moderate easterly breeze.

Extended Forecast

Thursday through Monday: Southern regions 6 and 9 can expect partly cloudy and sunny skies with scattered showers; elsewhere, mostly cloudy skies with frequent showers and isolated thundershowers. Rainfall is expected to be between 0 mm and 15 mm over southern regions 6 and 9, elsewhere between 10 mm and 25 mm within 24 hours.
