

HYDROMETEOROLOGICAL SERVICE MINISTRY OF AGRICULTURE

WEATHER BRIEF for Thursday 23 July 2026, from the Hydrometeorological Service, Guyana

Rainfall records for the past 24 hours, measured at 08:00 hours on Thursday, 23 July 2026, were available for some stations. Fort Island and Zeelandia in Region 3 recorded the highest rainfall of 9.4mm

Synopsis: Local convection generated weak to moderate instability over inland areas. Elsewhere, mostly stable conditions.

Weather review: Partly cloudy to cloudy skies with occasional showers and isolated thundershowers over Regions 7 and 10. In the other Regions, mostly sunny skies.

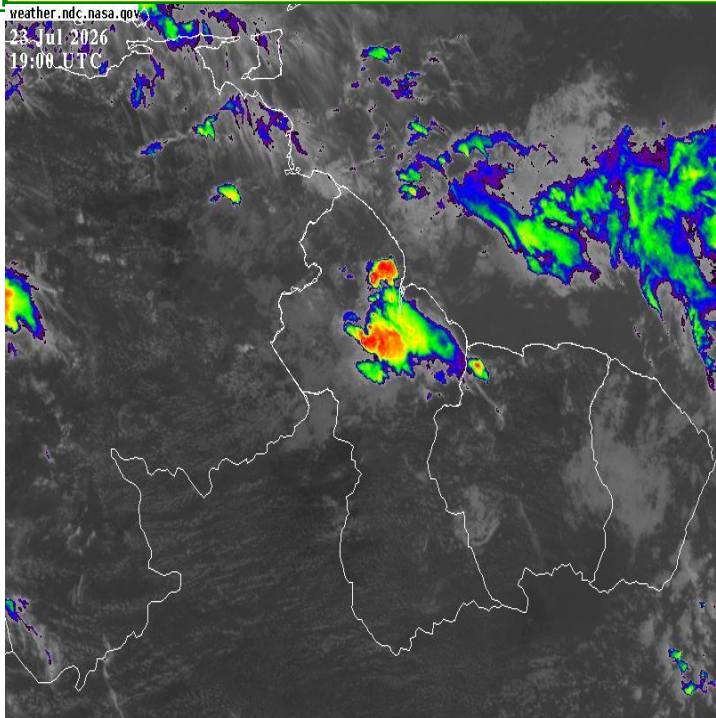

Georgetown's long-term daily average rainfall for the next 10 days, 19 July to 23 August 01 2026, is 7.4mm per day.

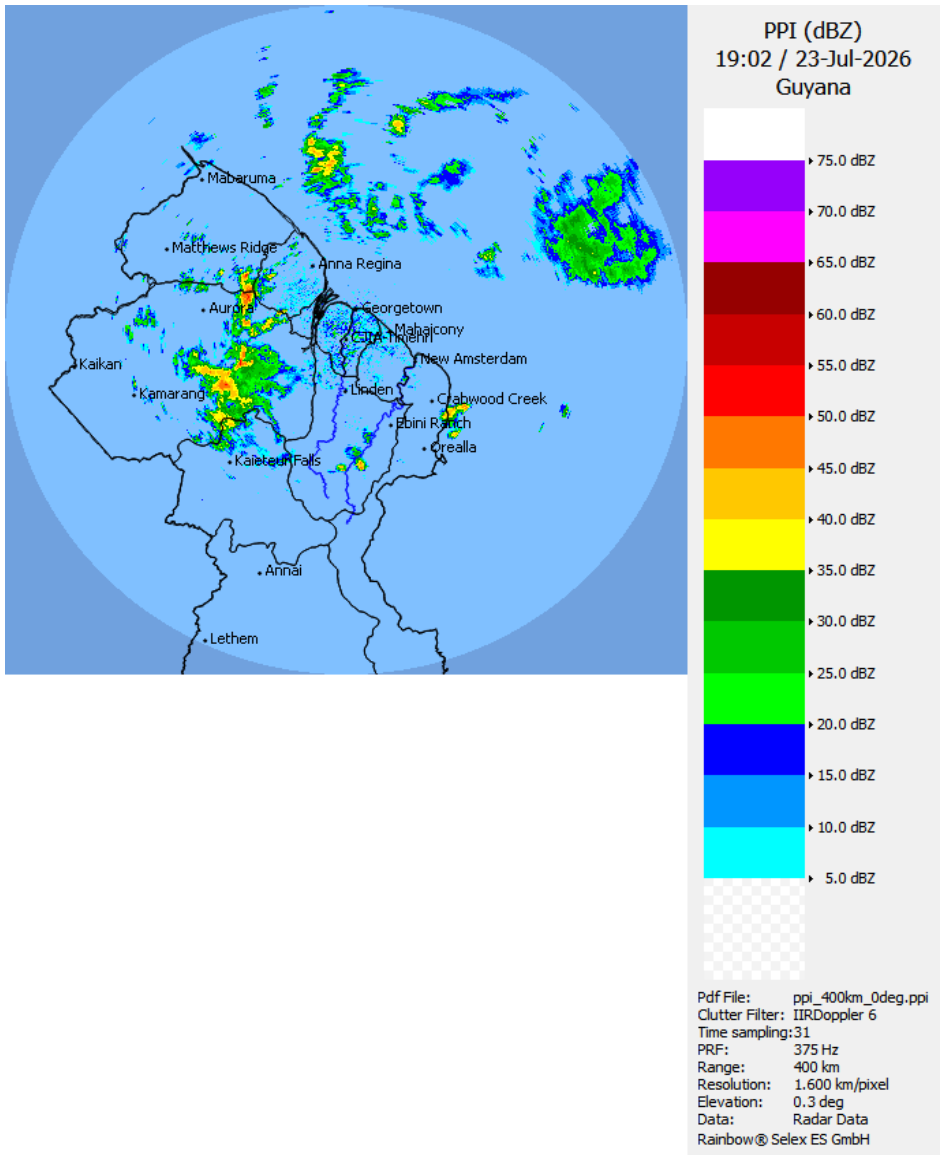

Winds: Light to Gentle Northeast breeze.

Saturday: Except for brief showers, fair and sunny skies will prevail. **Rainfall is not expected to be significant.**
Sunday: Mostly fair skies in the morning. For the remainder of the forecast period, Regions 7, 10, and inland areas of Regions 1 to 4 can expect scattered to occasional showers. Elsewhere, sunny skies. **Rainfall is expected to range between 0 and 20mm, the highest over Regions 7 and 10.**
Monday, Tuesday and Wednesday: Except for scattered showers over coastal areas in the morning and other areas in the remainder of the forecast period, fair and sunny skies are expected to dominate. **Rainfall is expected to range between 0 and 10mm.**
