

Weather Brief for Friday, 24 July 2026 from the Hydrometeorological Service, Guyana

Rainfall records for the past 24 hours, measured at 08:00hrs Friday, 24 July 2026 were available for most of the stations. Kamarang in Region 7 recorded the highest rainfall of 60.3 mm.

Severe Weather Advisory: Areas affected by thundershowers may experience strong wind gusts, heavy rainfall, and possible lightning strikes. Residents are advised to exercise caution during these conditions.

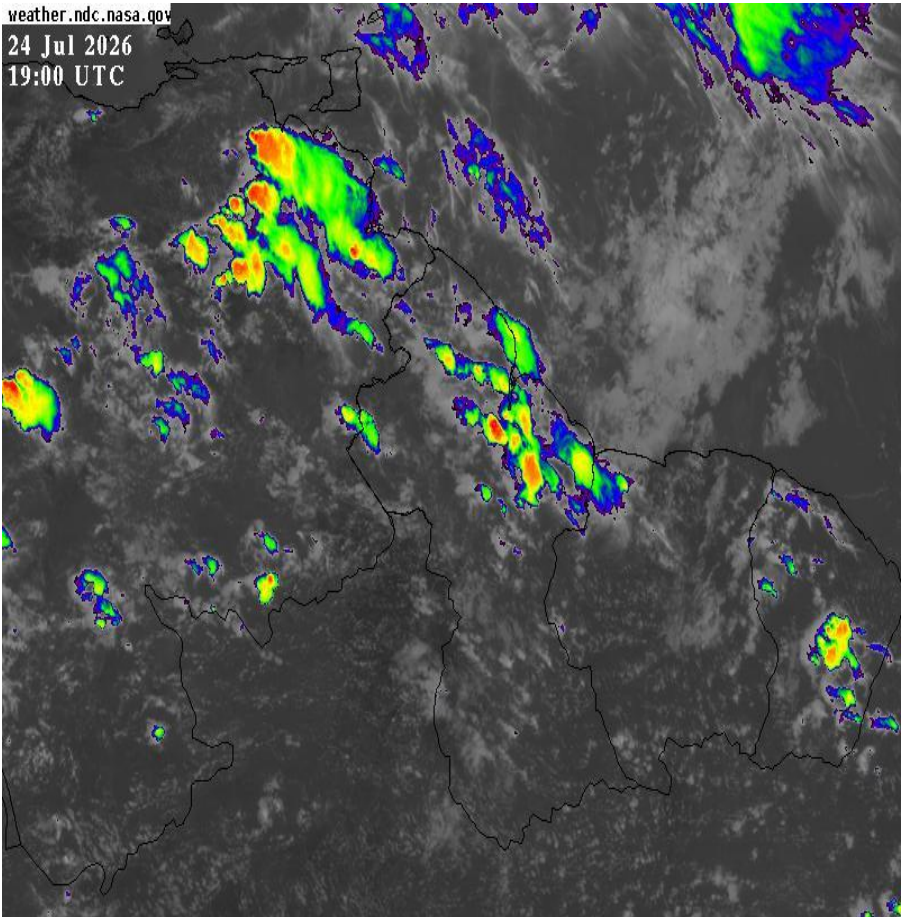
Synopsis: A tropical wave embedded within the ITCZ northeast of Guyana, currently inducing troughs over northern regions of the country, generating moderate instabilities. Tonight, into tomorrow, the wave will pass north of Guyana, producing an easterly to southeasterly flow, and as Saharan dust intensifies and ridging dominates, with mostly stable conditions over most of the forecast area.

Today’s weather review: Northern regions of Guyana observed cloudy spells with occasional showers and isolated thundershowers. Elsewhere, partly cloudy and sunny skies with brief afternoon showers.

Spring Tide Advisory: The Spring Tide is not in effect.

Sea conditions:

- Slight northeasterly seas with swells reaching 1.0 to 1.5 meters in open waters.
- These waves will likely have periods of between 7 and 8 seconds.
- Gentle to moderate easterly breeze.

Extended Forecast

Sunday and Monday: Partly cloudy skies with occasional showers and isolated thundershowers are likely over regions 1 to 4, 7, 8 and 10. Elsewhere, partly cloudy and sunny skies with scattered showers. Rainfall is expected to be between 5 mm and 20 mm over regions 1 to 4, 7, 8 and 10, elsewhere between 0 mm and 10 mm within 24 hours.

Tuesday through Thursday: Mostly cloudy skies with intermittent rain and thundershowers are likely across Guyana. Rainfall is expected to be between 20 mm and 50 mm within 24 hours.
