WEATHER BRIEF for Monday 27 July 2026, from the Hydrometeorological Service, Guyana

Rainfall records for the past 24 hours, measured at 08:00 hours on Monday, 27 July 2026, were available for some stations. Port Kaituma in Region 1 recorded the highest rainfall of 32.2mm

Synopsis: A tropical wave located northeast of Guyana is expected to interact with the Intertropical Convergence Zone (ITCZ), inducing a low-level trough across the country, resulting in unstable atmospheric conditions for the next 12 to 36 hours.

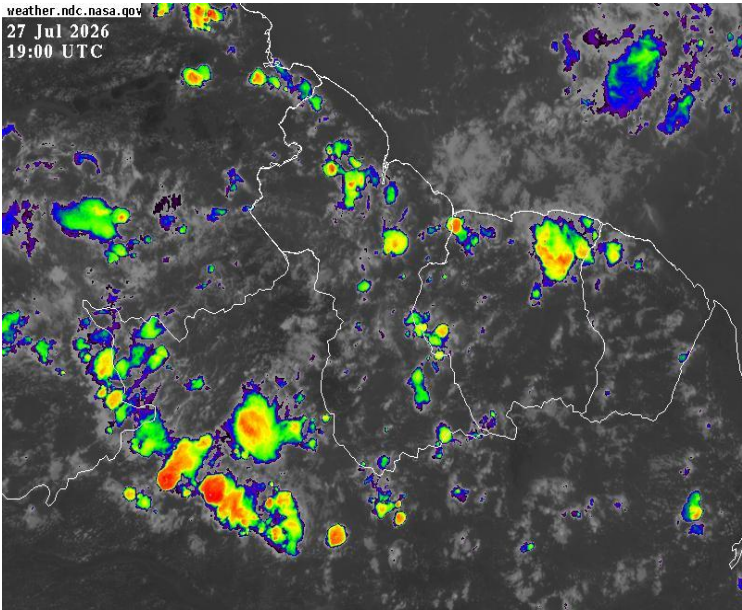
Weather review: Partly cloudy to cloudy skies with scattered to occasional showers and thundershowers in Regions 7, 10 and inland areas of Regions 1 to 5. Elsewhere, mostly sunny skies.

Georgetown's long-term daily average rainfall for the next 10 days, 27 July to August 05 2026, is 6.7mm per day.

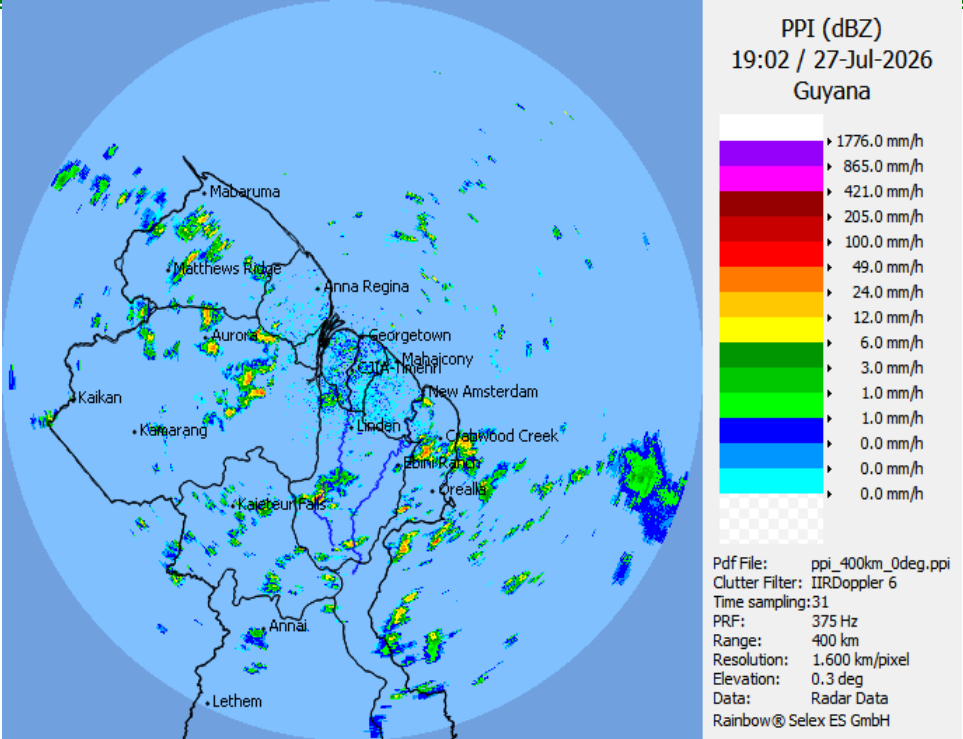

SEA CONDITIONS: Moderate in open waters with North-easterly swells reaching 1.0 to 2.0 meters (3 to 6ft) and increasing.

These waves will likely have periods of 7 and 8 seconds,

Winds: Light to Gentle Easterly to South-easterly breeze.

Wednesday: Early morning showers over Regions 6 and 9. Elsewhere, no significant rainfall. For the remainder of the forecast period, partly cloudy to cloudy skies, with scattered to occasional showers in all the Regions. **Rainfall is expected to range between 5 and 20mm, with the highest over Regions 7, 10 and North Region 6.**

Thursday: No significant rainfall in the early morning. In the late morning and the remainder of the forecast period, Regions 1 to 4 can expect scattered to occasional showers. Elsewhere, mostly sunny skies. **Rainfall is expected to range between 0 and 15mm.**

Friday through Sunday: Mostly fair and sunny skies are expected to be interrupted by scattered showers along coastal areas in the morning and other areas for the remainder of the forecast period. **Rainfall is expected to range between 0 and 10mm.**
