

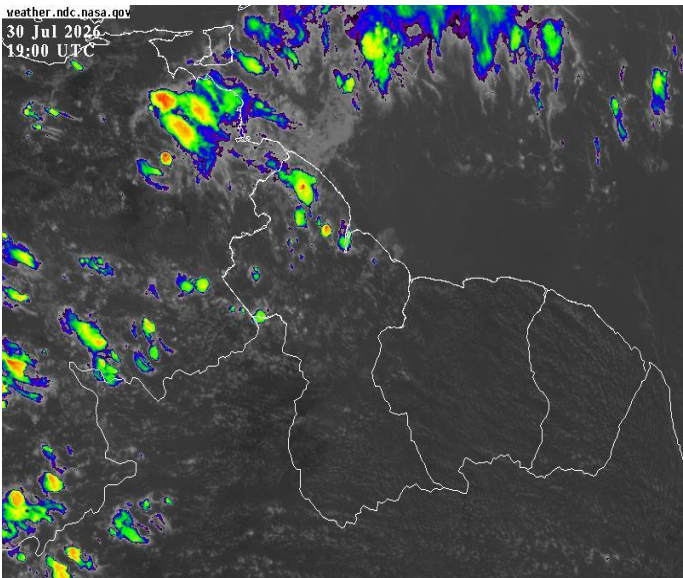

WEATHER BRIEF for Thursday 30 July 2026, from the Hydrometeorological Service, Guyana
Rainfall records for the past 24 hours, measured at 08:00 hours on Thursday, 30 July 2026, were available for some stations. Leguan in Region 3 recorded the highest rainfall of 79.9mm
Synopsis: Dry air and dust from the Saharan Air Layer (SAL) are drying up moisture from the Intertropical Convergence Zone (ITCZ), thus weakening deep convection; hence the atmosphere is mostly stable.
Weather review: Mostly sunny skies were interrupted by scattered showers over inland areas.

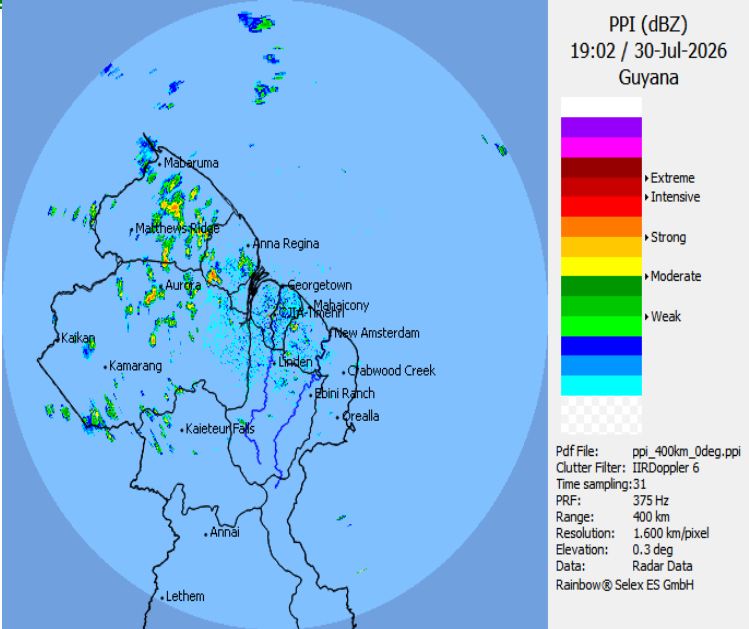
Georgetown's long-term daily average rainfall for the next 10 days, 30 July to August 08 2026, is 6.9mm per day.

SEA CONDITIONS: Moderate in open waters with North-easterly swells reaching 1.0 to 2.0 meters (3 to 6ft) and increasing.

These waves will likely have periods of 8 and 9 seconds,

Winds: Light to Gentle Easterly to South-easterly breeze.

Saturday: Mostly fair and sunny skies are expected to be interrupted by scattered showers along coastal areas in the morning and other areas for the remainder of the forecast period. Rainfall is expected to range between 0 and 10mm.

Sunday: No significant rainfall in the early morning. For the remainder of the forecast period, Regions 1 to 5, 10 and North Region 6 can expect scattered to occasional showers; thundershowers are likely. Elsewhere, no significant rainfall. Rainfall is expected to range between 0 and 20mm.

Monday through Wednesday: Except for scattered showers, mostly fair and sunny skies are expected to dominate. Rainfall is not expected to be significant.
