Weather Brief for Saturday, 14 June 2025 from the Hydrometeorological Service, Guyana.





Rainfall records for the past 24 hours, measured at 08:00hrs Saturday, 14 June 2025 were available for most of the stations.

Karawab in Region 2 recorded the highest rainfall of 59.4mm

Synopsis: Weak to mild instabilities from surface to low level confluence is affecting Guyana. The pressure gradient from the High-Pressure ridge is producing moderate to fresh east to southeasterlies across Guyana. This pattern is expected to continue throughout the weekend into early next week.

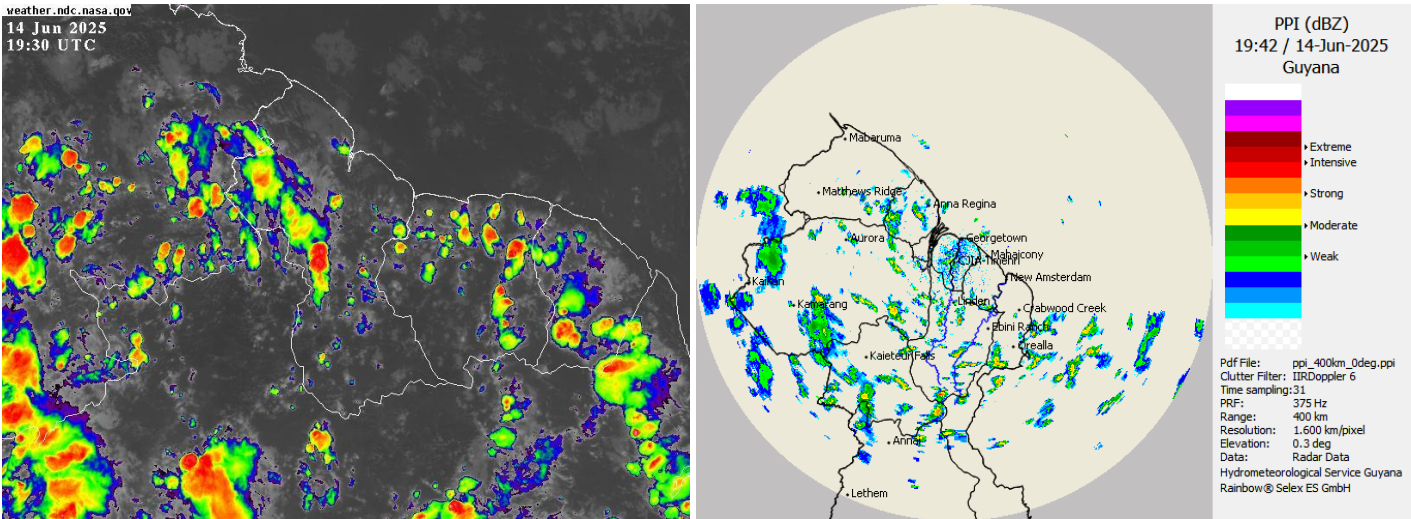
Today’s weather review: Mostly cloudy skies with occasional showers and isolated thundershowers was observed over inland areas.

The long-term daily average rainfall for Georgetown, for the next 10 days June 15, 2025 to June 24, 2025 is 11.2mm per day.

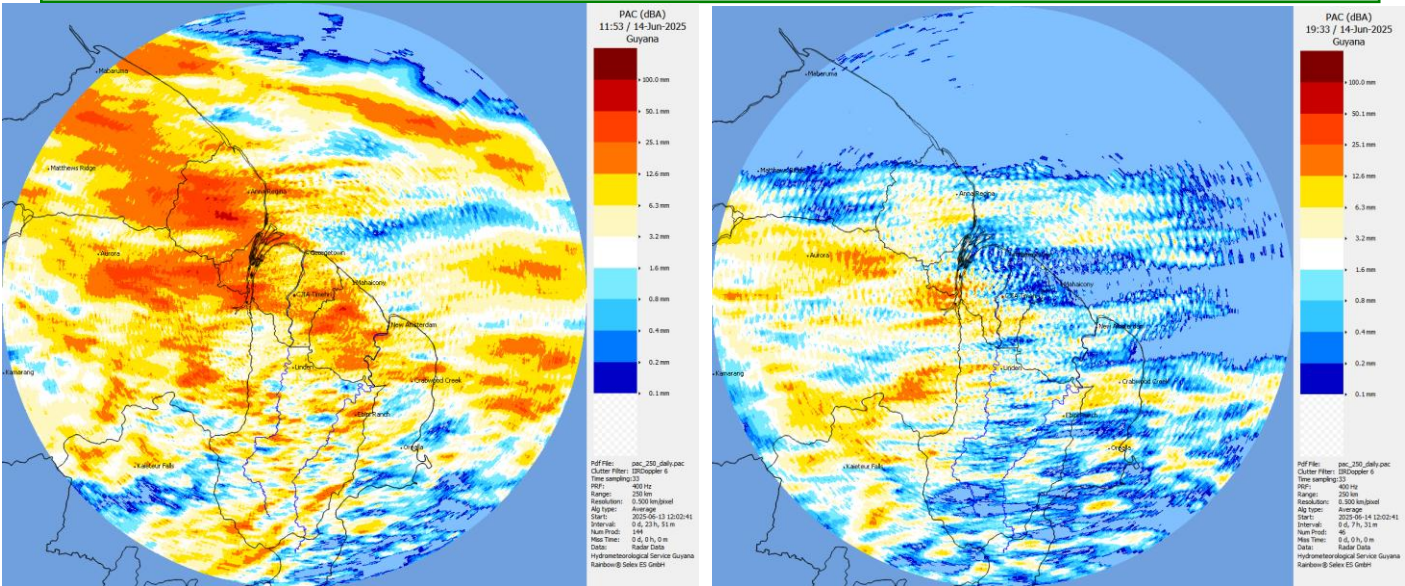
Severe Weather Warnings: In areas of thundershowers, heavy winds and lightning strikes can be expected.



Infrared Satellite and Radar images valid 19:30 UTC (15:30hrs) Saturday, 14 June 2025

Sea conditions:

- Moderate to rough seas in open waters with northeast to easterly swells reaching 2.0 to 3.0 meters (6 to 8 ft).
- These waves will likely have periods of between 7 and 8 seconds.
- Moderate to fresh Northeast to Easterly breeze.

Extended Forecast

Monday, Wednesday and Thursday: Partly cloudy to cloudy skies with scattered showers during the early morning and mid-evening. Rainfall is anticipated between 10 to 25 mm within 24 hours of accumulations.

Tuesday, cloudy to overcast skies with occasional to frequent showers over regions 1 to 6 and 10. All other areas will see fair to cloudy skies with brief to scattered showers. Rainfall is anticipated between 20 to 50 mm over regions 1 to 6 and 10 and between 10 to 20 mm elsewhere.

Friday, early morning thundershower and rain over coastal areas. all other areas will see scattered showers and isolated thundershowers during the day. Rainfall is anticipated between 30 to 60 mm over regions 2 to 5 and between 10 to 20 mm elsewhere.
