Rainfall records for the past 24 hours, measured at 08:00hrs Thursday, 19 June 2025 were available for most of the stations.

Hibernia in Region 2 recorded the highest rainfall of 99.2 mm

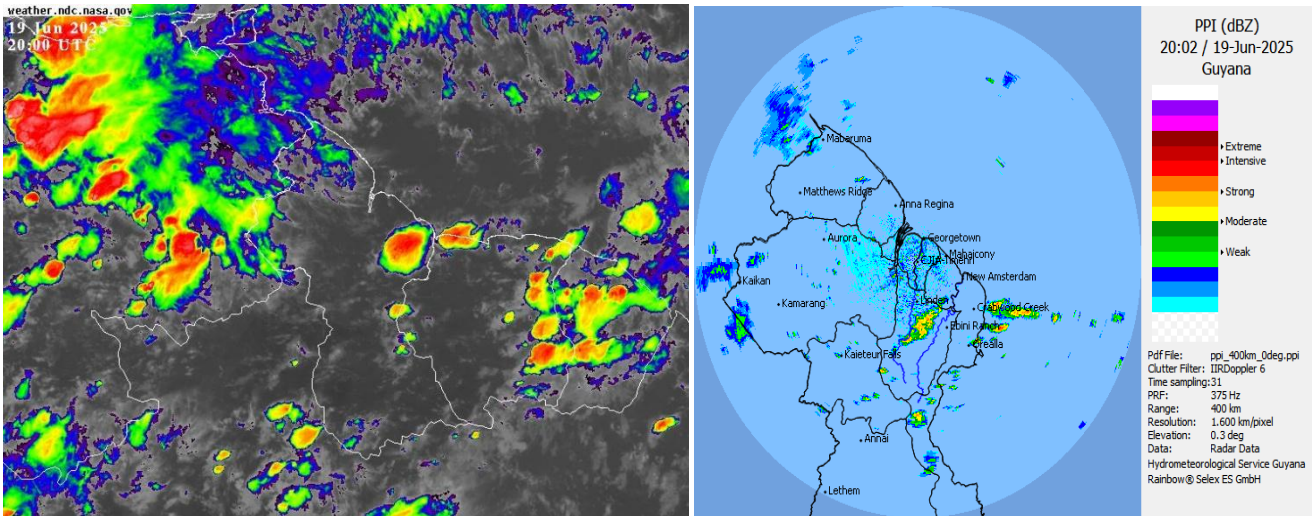
Synopsis: The ITCZ is affecting Guyana. This will continue into the new week.

Today's weather review: Cloudy to overcast skies with thundershowers and rain were observed over northern Guyana during the morning. Southern Guyana saw mostly cloudy skies with a few brief showers.

All other regions will see scattered to occasional light to moderate showers. <u>Winds:</u> Gentle to moderate east to southerly breeze becoming windy before and during heavy downpours and thundershowers. <u>Minimum temperatures:</u> Coast: 21 °C – 23 °C Hinterland: 18 °C – 22 °C	Regions 1 to 10	 Rainfall is expected between 30 and 60 mm over regions 1 to 3, and between 10 to 20 mm elsewhere.	Cloudy skies can be expected over northern Guyana with frequent showers and intermittent rain during the morning. Thundershowers can be expected over regions 1 to 3 and 8. Southern Guyana will see scattered showers in the early afternoon. <u>Winds:</u> Moderate east to southerly breeze becoming windy before and during heavy downpours and thundershowers. <u>Maximum temperatures:</u> Coast: 27 °C – 29 °C Hinterland: 28 °C – 31 °C

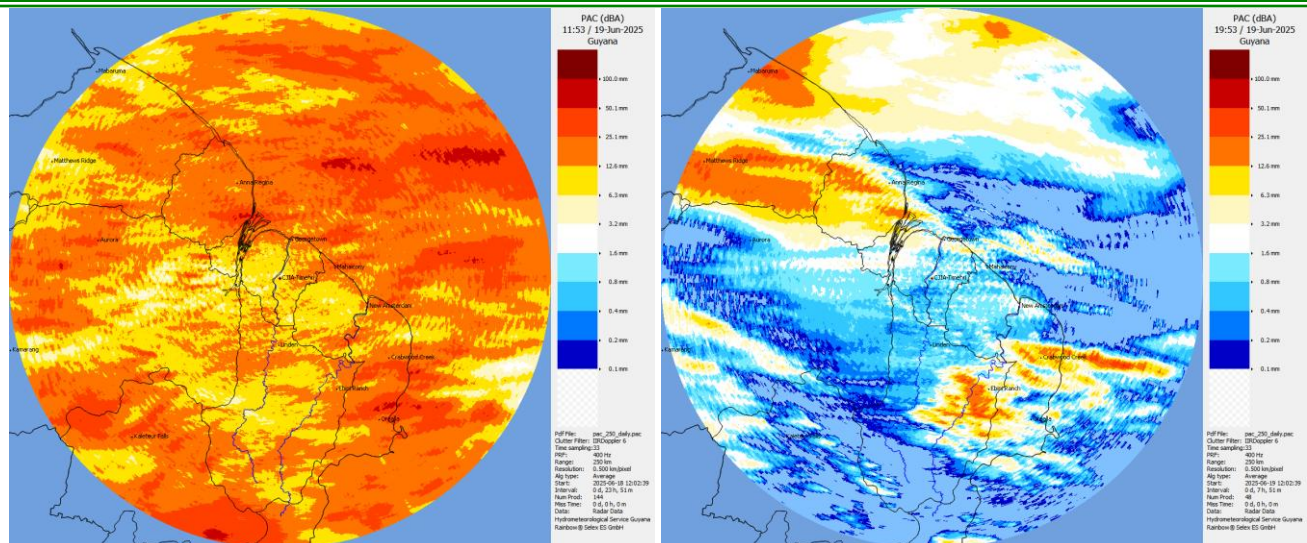
The long-term daily average rainfall for Georgetown, for the next 10 days June 20, 2025 to June 29, 2025 is 10.6 mm per day.



Infrared Satellite and Radar images valid 20:00 UTC (16:00 hrs) Thursday, 19 June 2025

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Radar generated precipitation estimates. Twenty-four- and eight-hours rainfall valid 8 hrs and 16 hrs on the Thursday, 19 June 2025.

Sea conditions:

Moderate to rough in open waters with northeasterly to easterly swells reaching 2.0 to 3.0 meters (6 to 8 ft) and increasing.

- These waves will likely have periods of between 8 and 9 seconds.
- Fresh easterly breeze.

Extended Forecast

Saturday: Cloudy skies with frequent showers can be expected during the morning. Rainfall is anticipated between 20 to 50 mm.

Sunday and Monday, partly cloudy to cloudy skies with brief to scattered showers and isolated thundershowers. **Rainfall is expected between 0 and 10 mm.**

Tuesday and Wednesday, Cloudy skies with occasional showers and isolated thundershowers. Rainfall between 10 to 30 mm.
