## HYDROMETEOROLOGICAL SERVICE MINISTRY OF AGRICULTURE

WEATHER BRIEF for Friday 20 June 2025, from the Hydrometeorological Service, Guyana-

Rainfall records for the past 24 hours, measured at 08:00hrs on Friday, 20 June 2025, were available for some stations. Amelia's Ward in Region 10 recorded the highest rainfall of 90.2mm.

Synopsis: Weak to moderate instability affecting the forecast area. The Intertropical Convergence Zone (ITCZ) is the main synoptic feature and is expected to interact with a Tropical wave (Tw) in the next 12 to 24 hours.

Weather review: Partly cloudy to cloudy skies with frequent showers and thundershowers in Regions 7, 8, 10, and North Region 6, in the other Regions, scattered showers.



Georgetown's long-term daily average rainfall for the next 10 days, 20 June to 29 June 2025, is 10.6mm per day.


## Weather Warnings: .

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<u>Sunday</u>: Partly cloudy to cloudy with scattered showers in the early morning. For the remainder of the forecast period, cloudy with frequent showers are expected in Regions 4 and 10. Elsewhere, scattered to occasional showers. Rainfall between 20 and 40mm, in Regions 4, and 10. Elsewhere, between 10 and 20mm.

<u>Monday</u>: Partly cloudy with scattered showers in the early morning. For the remainder of the forecast period, cloudy with frequent showers, in Regions 1 to 4. Elsewhere, partly cloudy and sunny skies with scattered showers. Rainfall between 15 and 40mm, in Regions 1 to 4, and in the other Regions, 0 and 15mm.

<u>Tuesday</u>: In the early morning, cloudy to overcast skies with frequent showers, and intermittent in Regions 1 to 4 and 7. Elsewhere, partly cloudy with scattered showers. In the late morning and the remainder of the forecast period, partly cloudy and sunny with scattered showers. Rainfall between 15 and 40mm, in Regions 1 to 4, and 7. Elsewhere between 0 and 15mm.

<u>Wednesday and Thursday</u>: Partly cloudy to cloudy skies with scattered showers in all of the Regions. Rainfall between 5 and 15mm.
