Severe Weather Warnings: Soils across many areas are already saturated due to continuous rainfall, and forecast conditions indicate additional rainfall in the coming days. This is expected to increase the likelihood and severity of flooding, particularly in low-lying, flood-prone, and poorly drained areas. Existing flooding across Hinterland Guyana is also expected to persist and may worsen where significant rainfall occurs. Residents in hilly and elevated areas should remain alert, as heavy downpours may trigger localized landslides or mudslides. In areas experiencing thundershowers, strong wind gusts, frequent lightning strikes, and intense rainfall can be expected.

Persons are advised to remain vigilant and take all necessary precautions to safeguard life and property.

Weather Brief for Thursday, 04 June 2026 from the Hydrometeorological Service, Guyana.

Rainfall records for the past 24 hours, measured at 08:00hrs available for most of the stations.

Coomacka in Region 10 recorded the highest rainfall of 42.4mm.

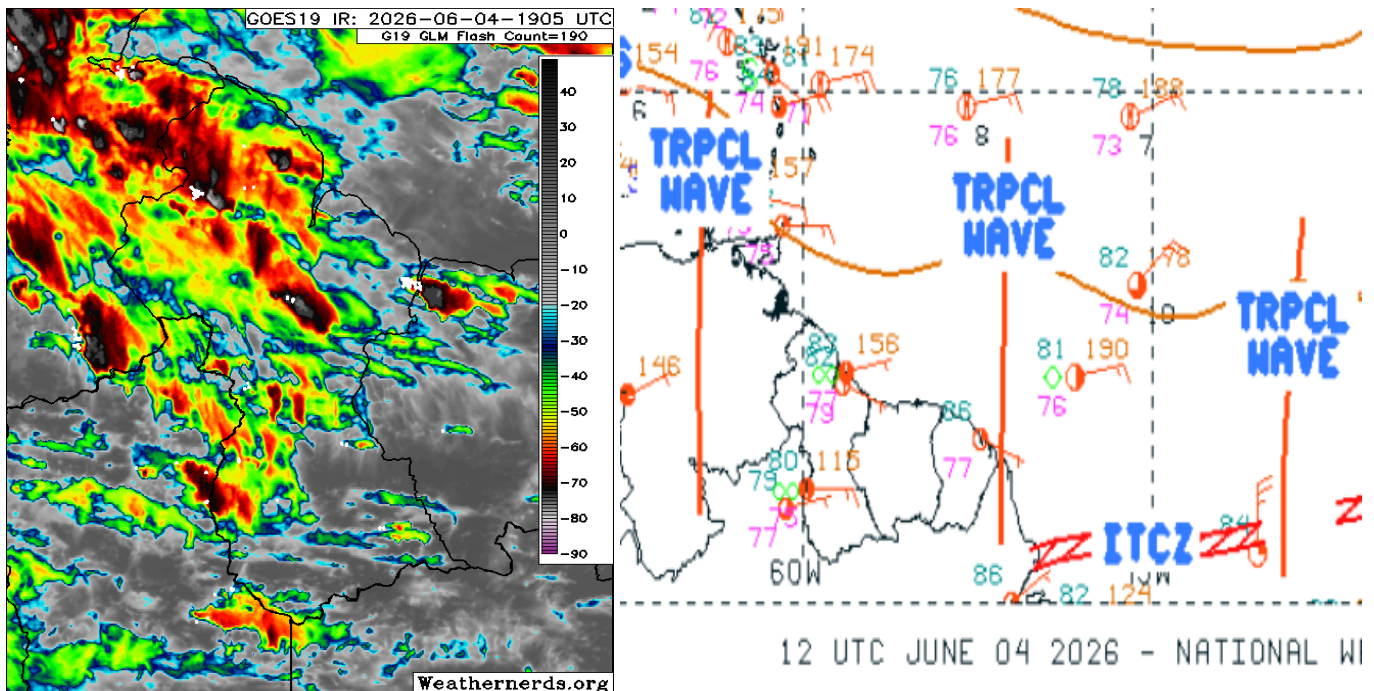
Synopsis: Weak to moderate instabilities along the axis of the ITCZ are currently affecting Guyana and are expected to persist through the weekend. Tropical Wave #10 is forecast to cross Guyana on Friday, followed by Tropical Wave #11 on Saturday. Current model guidance indicates limited dynamics and energy associated with Wave #10, resulting in only modest enhancement of rainfall activity. In contrast, Wave #11 is expected to interact with a more favorable atmospheric environment, increasing the likelihood of moderate to heavy rainfall, particularly across coastal areas.

Today's weather review: Mostly cloudy skies with scattered and intermittent showers were observed across Guyana.

Sea conditions:

Open waters are expected to be gentle to moderate with northeasterly to easterly swells reaching 1.5 to 2.5 meters (4 to 7 feet) and steady.

- Wave periods will range between 8 and 9 seconds.
- Gentle to moderate easterly breeze.

Extended Forecast

Saturday and Sunday: Cloudy to overcast skies with intermittent to continuous showers and rain. Thunderstorms are likely over coastal areas. **Rainfall is anticipated to be between 30 and 70 mm within 24 hours. The highest values are likely over coastal areas.**

Monday: a Mix of sunshine and clouds with a few isolated to scattered showers. **Rainfall is anticipated to be less than 15 mm.**

Tuesday and Wednesday: Cloudy to overcast skies with intermittent to frequent showers and rain. **Rainfall is expected to be between 40 and 60 mm within 24 hours of accumulation.**
