WEATHER BRIEF for Saturday 01, March 2025, from the Hydrometeorological Service, Guyana-

Rainfall records for the past 24 hours, measured at 08:00hrs Saturday, 01 March 2025, were available for some stations. Sophia in Region 4 recorded the highest rainfall of 4.6mm.

Synopsis: Stable conditions continued over the forecast area. The Sahara Air Layer(SAL) is the dominant feature and will continue into the new Week.


<u>Today's Weather review</u>: Sunny and hazy skies dominated all Regions.

## **Extended Forecast:**

<u>Monday through to Wednesday</u>: Fair and sunny skies are expected to be interrupted by scattered showers over the ten administrative Regions. Rainfall is not expected to be significant.

<u>Thursday and Friday</u>: Fair skies in the night, for the remainder of the day, except for scattered showers, sunny skies will dominate.. Rainfall is expected to range between 0.0 and 10.0, the maximum over South Regions 6 and 9.
