Weather Brief for Wednesday, 04 March 2026 from the Hydrometeorological Service, Guyana

Rainfall records for the past 24 hours, measured at 08:00hrs Wednesday, 04 March 2026 were available for most of the stations. **No.4 Backdam in Region 5 recorded the highest rainfall of 11.2 mm.**

Saharan Dust Advisory: Mild to moderate concentrations of Saharan dust are currently affecting Guyana, resulting in hazy conditions, reduced visibility, suppression of rainfall, and diminished air quality over parts of the country. These dust concentrations are expected to gradually decrease from tomorrow into the next 5 to 6 days.

Marine Advisory: Spring tide coupled with rough seas will likely result in over-topping of sea defenses and generate hazardous sea conditions. All marine users and persons in low-lying and riverine areas are asked to take the necessary precautions.


Synopsis: A strong Atlantic High-pressure system, along with mild to moderate Saharan Air Layer (SAL) concentrations, widespread atmospheric subsidence, is creating mainly stable weather conditions. For the next 5–6 days a decrease in SAL and a slight increase in moisture, with brief interruptions of weak to moderate, scattered instability due to small perturbations, trade-wind moisture plumes, and localized factors.

Today's weather review: A mix of sunshine and clouds with brief scattered showers was observed across Guyana.

Spring Tide Advisory: This period of Spring Tide is in effect until March 7, 2026.

Sea conditions:

- Rough northeasterly to easterly seas with swells reaching 3.0 to 3.5 meters in open waters.
- These waves will likely have periods of between 9 and 10 seconds.
- Moderate to fresh easterly breeze.

Extended Forecast

Friday through Tuesday: A mix of sunshine and clouds with brief scattered showers are likely across Guyana. **Rainfall is expected between 0 mm and 15 mm within 24 hours.**
