Weather Brief for Sunday, 08 March 2026 from the Hydrometeorological Service, Guyana

Rainfall records for the past 24 hours, measured at 08:00hrs Sunday, 08 March 2026 were available for most of the stations. **Leonora Corner in Region 3 recorded the highest rainfall of 56.5 mm.**


Synopsis: Atlantic high pressure system continues generate moderate to fresh winds across the forecast area. As increase in moisture at various levels, convergence and confluence at surface to lower levels producing weak to moderate instabilities. Similar atmospheric dynamics are to prevail in the upcoming 2 to 3 days.

Today's weather review: Partly cloudy to cloudy skies with scattered to frequent light showers were observed across Guyana.

Spring Tide Advisory: The Spring Tide is not in effect.

Sea conditions:

- Moderate to rough northeasterly to easterly seas with swells reaching 2.5 to 3.0 meters in open waters.
- These waves will likely have periods of between 8 and 9 seconds.
- Moderate to fresh easterly breeze.

Extended Forecast

Tuesday through Wednesday: Mostly cloudy skies with occasional showers over coastal Guyana and frequent showers elsewhere. Rainfall is expected between 5 mm and 20 mm coastal areas, elsewhere between 10 mm and 35 mm within 24 hours.

Thursday through Saturday: Cloudy skies with intermittent to frequent showers and rain are likely over Guyana. Rainfall is expected between 20 mm and 50 mm within 24 hours.
