19, 2026 WEATHER BRIEF for Tuesday 03 March 2026, from the Hydrometeorological Service, Guyana-

Rainfall records for the past 24 hours, measured at 08:00 hours on Tuesday, 03 March 2026, were available for some stations. Zeelandia in Region 3 recorded the highest rainfall of 27.0mm

Synopsis: High-pressure ridge and the Sahara Air Layer(SAL) are the dominant synoptic features. However, pulses of moisture in the lower levels due to local convection generated occasional showers mostly in Regions 3, 4, 7, 8, and 10.

Weather review: Partly cloudy to cloudy skies with occasional showers in Regions 3, 4, 7,8, and 10. Elsewhere brief showers

Georgetown's long-term daily average rainfall for the next 10 days, 03 March to 12 March 2026, is 3.9m per day.


Weather Warning: None at this time.

Advisory Saharan Dust A plume of Saharan Dust is currently affecting Guyana, resulting in hazy skies and reduced visibility across parts of the country. Concentrations are expected to be moderate, with occasional fluctuations depending on wind conditions.


Expected Conditions:

- Hazy or milky sky conditions,
- Reduced horizontal visibility,
- Increased atmospheric dryness,
- Slight reduction in air quality
- Possible suppression of shower activity in some areas.

Winds: Moderate to fresh North-easterly to Easterly breeze.

Thursday and Friday: Partly cloudy to cloudy skies in the early morning with scattered showers in Regions 2 to 6 and 10. In the other Regions, no significant rainfall. **Rainfall will range between 0 and 10 mm.**

Saturday: Early morning cloudy skies with scattered showers in Regions 7, 8, North and Central Region 6. Elsewhere, partly cloudy with no significant rainfall. In the late morning and the remainder of the forecast period, mostly sunny skies may be interrupted by brief passing showers. **Rainfall will range between 0 and 25 mm.**

Sunday and Monday: Mostly fair and sunny skies may be interrupted by periods of cloudiness with brief showers, along coastal areas in the morning and other areas in the afternoon. **Rainfall will range between 0 and 10 mm.**
