Marine Warnings: A small craft and High Surf Advisory is in effect as strong surface winds and high-energy waves continue to generate rough and dangerous sea conditions along the coast of Guyana.

Saharan Dust Advisory: A slight plume of Saharan Dust is currently affecting Guyana, resulting in hazy skies and reduced visibility across parts of the country. Concentrations are expected to be moderate over the coming days, with occasional fluctuations depending on wind conditions.

Weather Brief for Monday, 02 March 2026 from the Hydrometeorological Service, Guyana.

Rainfall records for the past 24 hours, measured at 08:00hrs available for most of the stations.

No significant rainfall was recorded.


Synopsis: A strong high-pressure ridge continues to dominate weather conditions across Guyana. Moisture embedded within the trade winds is still moving along the southern edge of the ridge, bringing occasional cloudiness and brief showers to the wider Guianas region. This general pattern is forecast to persist through the rest of the week. Additionally, concentrations of Saharan dust are expected to gradually increase, which may lead to hazy conditions, reduced visibility, and slightly drier air across the area.

Today's weather review: Sunny skies were observed throughout most of Guyana with some increase in cloudiness and brief showers towards the afternoon in coastal areas.

SPRING TIDE ADVISORY: Spring Tides will likely result in overtopping of river and sea defences in vulnerable areas. All precautions should be exercised.

Sea conditions:

Open waters are expected to be rough with northeast to easterly swells reaching 2.5 to 3.5 metres (7 to 11 feet) and decreasing.

- Wave periods will range between 9 and 10 seconds.
- Moderate to fresh northeast to easterly breeze.

Extended Forecast

Wednesday and Thursday: Partly cloudy to cloudy skies with a few isolated to scattered showers. Rainfall is expected to be less than 15 mm.

Friday, sunny skies during the morning. In the afternoon, increasing cloudiness with occasional to frequent showers throughout southern Guyana. Rainfall is anticipated to be between 20 and 50 mm.

Saturday: Cloudy to overcast skies with intermittent to frequent showers can be expected across Regions 3 to 10. Rainfall is anticipated to be between 20 and 60 mm.

Sunday, a mix of sunshine and clouds with scattered showers. Rainfall expected to be less than 15 mm.
