Severe Weather Warnings: Recent rainfall has saturated soils, increasing the risk of flooding in low-lying and poorly drained areas. Hilly regions may experience mudslides, while thunderstorms could bring strong winds and lightning. Drivers should exercise caution due to reduced visibility and slippery roads. Residents are urged to take necessary precautions to protect life and property.

Marine Advisory: Long-period waves are expected to affect coastal waters, leading to rough sea conditions. Mariners and small craft operators are advised to exercise caution, as wave surges may become hazardous. Sea users and residents in coastal areas should remain alert and take the necessary precautions.

Rainfall records for the past 24 hours, measured at 08:00hrs available for most of the stations.

Wismar in Region 10 recorded the highest rainfall of 30.0 mm.

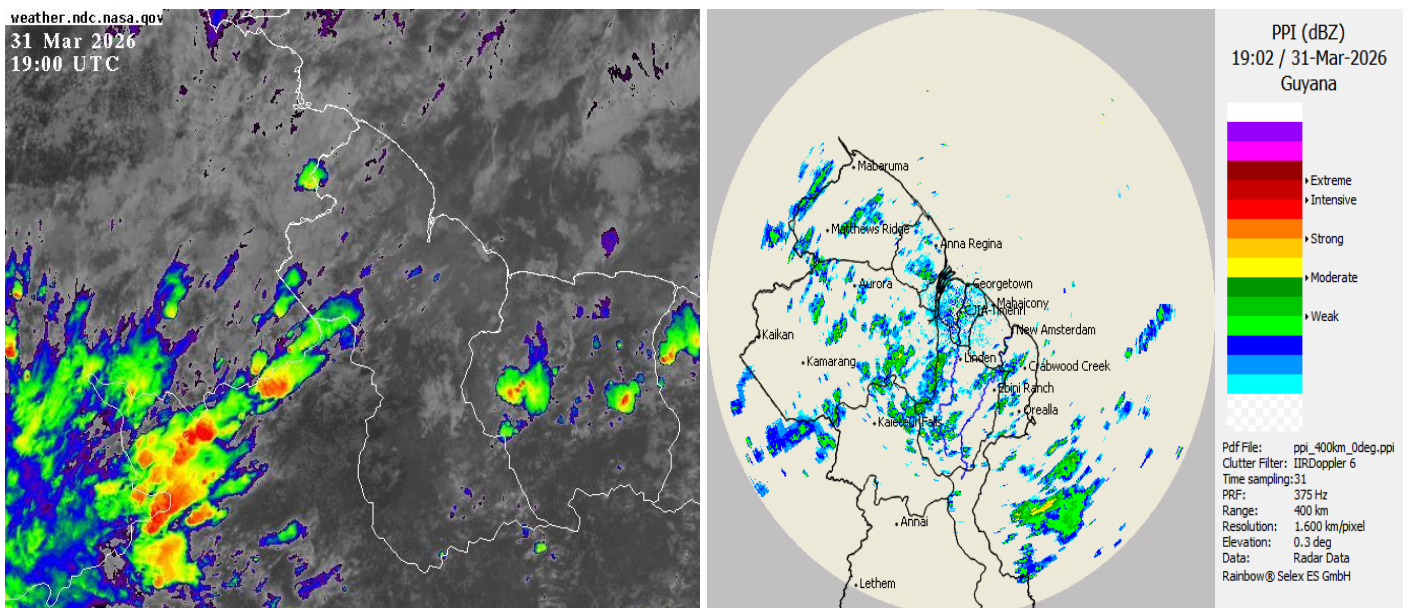
Synopsis: Weak to mild atmospheric instabilities are affecting Guyana and are expected to persist throughout the week, with a likely increase on Friday and Saturday.

Today's weather review: Cloudy to overcast skies were observed throughout Guyana with scattered showers.

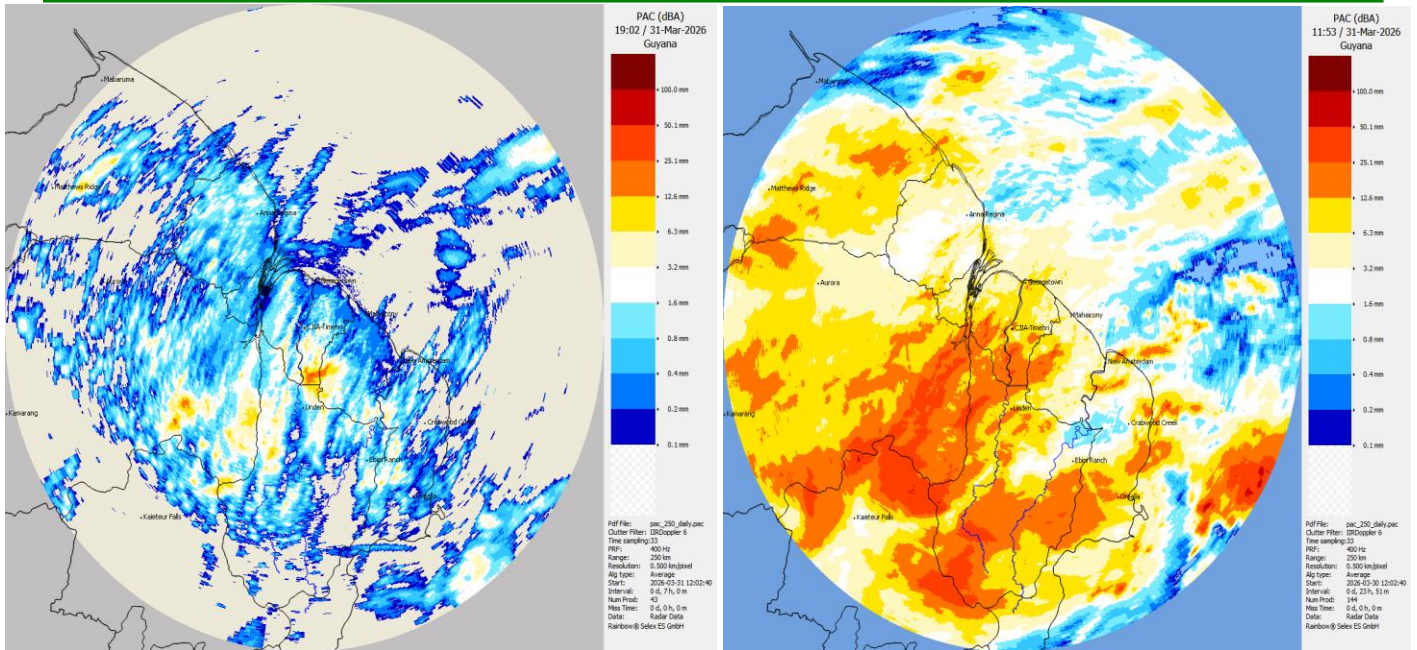
The long-term daily average rainfall for Georgetown, for the next 10 days, April 1, 2026, to April 10, 2026, is 3.7 mm per day.

Sea conditions:

Open waters are expected to be gentle to moderate with northeasterly swells reaching 1.0 to 2.0 metres (3 to 5 feet) and steady.

- Wave periods will range between 11 and 12 seconds.
- Gentle to moderate north-east to easterly breeze.

Extended Forecast

Thursday: Mostly cloudy skies are expected across Guyana, with scattered to occasional showers continuing through the early afternoon. Rainfall is expected to be between 10 and 30 mm.

Friday and Saturday: Cloudy to overcast skies with intermittent to frequent showers and rain. Thunderstorms are likely during the morning hours. Rainfall is anticipated to be between 50 and 80 mm within 24 hours of accumulation.

Sunday and Monday, a mix of sunshine and clouds with possible brief isolated showers. Rainfall is expected to be less than 15 mm.
