Weather Brief for Friday, 30 May 2025 from the Hydrometeorological Service, Guyana.

Rainfall records for the past 24 hours, measured at 08:00hrs Friday, 30 May 2025 were available for most of the stations.

Bartica Agri in Region 7 recorded the highest rainfall of 37.0 mm


<u>Synopsis:</u> Weak instabilities are affecting Guyana. The model forecast shows a slow but steady regeneration of the ITCZ over the weekend.

<u>Today's weather review</u>: Sunny skies were observed throughout Guyana with a few cloudy periods and scattered showers in the midmorning into early afternoon over inland areas.

Spring tides coupled with high waves may lead to overtopping of the river and sea defence vulnerable areas. All necessary precautions should be taken.

Sea conditions:

MODERATE SEAS IN OPEN WATERS WITH NORTHEAST TO EASTERLY SWELLS REACHING 1.5 TO 2.5 METERS (5 TO 7FT) AND STEADY.

- -These waves will likely have periods of between 7 and 8 seconds.
- Moderate northeast to easterly breeze.

Extended Forecast

Tuesday and Thursday: Partly cloudy to cloudy skies with brief to scattered showers. Rainfall between 0 and 15 mm.

<u>Sunday, Monday, and Wednesday</u>, cloudy to overcast skies in the morning with frequent showers and isolated thundershowers. Rainfall is anticipated between 30 to 50 mm within 24 hours of accumulation.
