Weather Brief for Saturday, 09 May 2026 from the Hydrometeorological Service, Guyana.



Rainfall records for the past 24 hours, measured at 08:00hrs available for most of the stations.

Wowetta in Region 9 recorded the highest rainfall of 58.9 mm.

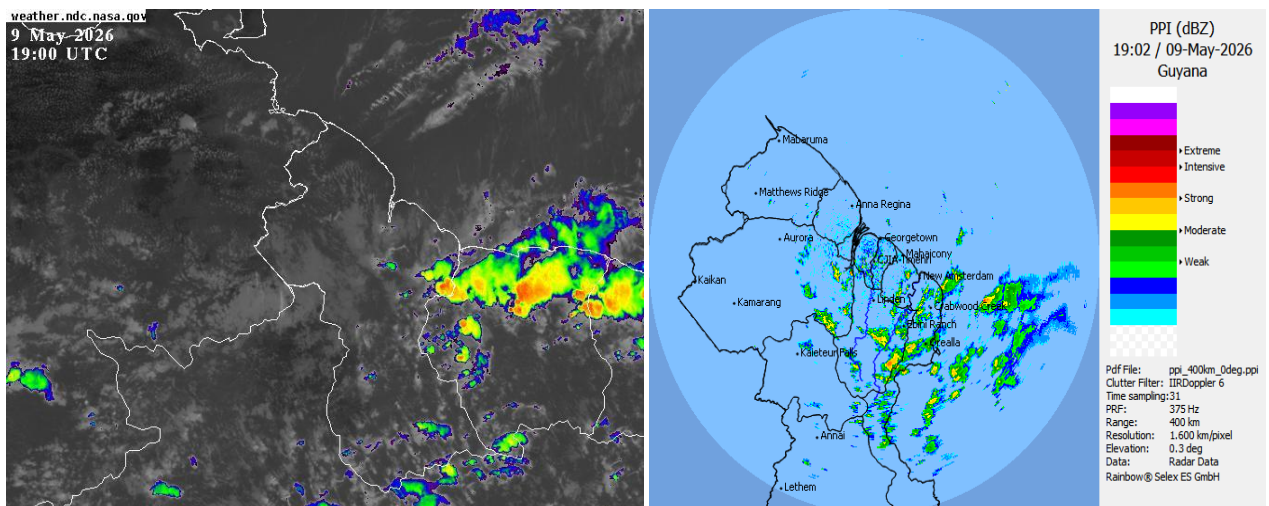
Synopsis: Converging winds and shallow to moderate moisture plumes are steadily moving into Guyana ahead of Tropical Wave #2. This is expected to bring temporary unstable conditions across the country, particularly over coastal areas. Forecast models indicate that this pattern will persist until Wednesday, along with the passage of the Tropical Wave on Monday. Inland and southern Guyana are expected to experience comparatively weaker atmospheric dynamics; however, localized heating and topographical lifting will play a more significant role in convective development and the maintenance of atmospheric energy.

Today's weather review: Cloudy skies were observed over Regions 4 to 6 and 10, with frequent showers and periods of rain affecting Regions 6 and 10. Scattered showers were observed across inland portions of Regions 3 to 5 and parts of Region 7, while sunny skies prevailed elsewhere.

Sea conditions:

Open waters are expected to be gentle to moderate with northeasterly swells reaching 1.0 to 2.0 meters (4 to 6 feet).

- Wave periods will range between 6 and 7 seconds.
- Moderate northeast to easterly breeze.

Extended Forecast

Monday to Wednesday: Cloudy to overcast skies can be expected across Guyana with frequent showers and rain. Thundershowers can be expected in the early to mid-morning and mid-afternoon. **Rainfall is anticipated to be between 60 and 80 mm within 24 hours of accumulation.**

Thursday and Friday: Mostly cloudy skies with intermittent to occasional showers and isolated thundershowers. **Rainfall is anticipated to be between 20 and 40 mm within 24 hours of accumulation.**
