# HYDROMETEOROLOGICAL SERVICE MINISTRY OF AGRICULTURE

#### WEATHER BRIEF for Saturday 04 October 2025, from the Hydrometeorological Service, Guyana-

Rainfall records for the past 24 hours, measured at 08:00 hours on Saturday, 04 October 2025, were available for some stations. Timehri in region 4 recorded the highest rainfall of 33.4mm.

Synopsis: Weak to moderate instabilities driven by localised heating and surface confluencing gave rise to scattered moderate to deep convective development.


Weather review: Scattered showers and thundershowers in Regions 7, 8, 10, Central Region 6, and inland areas of Regions 1 to 3. Elsewhere, mostly sunny skies.


Georgetown's long-term daily average rainfall for the next 10 days, 04 to 13 October 2025, is 2.5mm per day.

<u>SEA CONDITIONS</u>: Long-period and high-energy waves, coupled with spring tides, will likely result in overtopping and damage to river and sea defenses in vulnerable areas. Persons residing in riverine and low-lying areas are asked to be alert and exercise all caution in efforts to safeguard life and property during this time.

Winds: Light to Gentle Easterly to South-easterly breeze.

<u>Tonight</u>: Partly cloudy to cloudy skies with scattered showers in Regions 8, 9, Central, and South Region 6. Elsewhere, no significant rainfall. Rainfall is between 0 and 15mm.

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Monday: Partly cloudy with no significant rainfall in the early morning. For the remainder of the forecast period, partly cloudy to cloudy with scattered to occasional showers in all of the Regions. Rainfall ranges from 5 to 20mm. Tuesday: Partly cloudy to cloudy with scattered showers in coastal areas in the early morning. In the late morning and the remainder of the forecast period, Regions 1, 2, the South Regions 6 and 9 can expect occasional showers and thundershowers. Elsewhere, scattered showers. Rainfall ranges from 20 and 40mm. in Regions 1, 2, and the South Regions 6 and 9. Elsewhere, between 5 and 15mm.

<u>Wednesday through Friday</u>: Partly cloudy to cloudy skies with scattered showers in all of the Regions. Rainfall ranges from 5 and 15mm
