Weather Brief for Tuesday, 14 October 2025 from the Hydrometeorological Service, Guyana.

Rainfall records for the past 24 hours, measured at 08:00hrs Tuesday, 14 October 2025 were available for most of the stations.

Fort Island in Region 3 recorded the highest rainfall of 13.0mm.

Synopsis: Weak instabilities driven by localized heating are affecting Guyana.

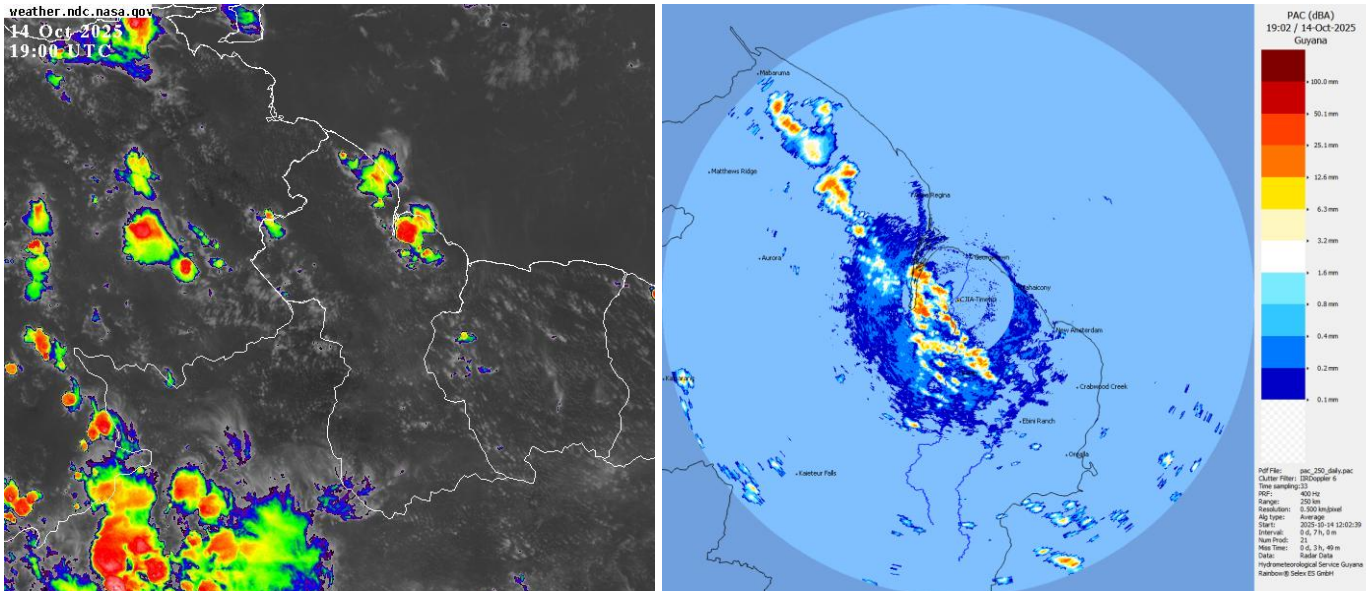
Today's weather review: Apart from isolated thundershowers over inland areas of regions 1 to 5, mainly fair and sunny skies can be expected.

Cloudy skies can be expected across Guyana with isolated to scattered showers. In the early afternoon, thundershowers can be expected over regions 1, 2, and 7. <u>Winds:</u> Moderate Easterly to South-easterly breeze. <u>Maximum temperatures:</u> Coast: 29 °C – 32°C Hinterland: 27 °C – 30 °C

The long-term daily average rainfall for Georgetown, for the next 10 days, October 14, 2025, to October 23, 2025, is 2.9 mm per day.

Severe Weather Warnings: In areas of thundershowers, heavy winds and lightning strikes may be observed.

Sea conditions:

Smooth to moderate in open waters with northeasterly waves reaching 1.0 to 1.5 meters (3 to 5 ft) and steady.

- These waves will likely have periods of 7 and 10 seconds.
- Gentle east to southeasterly breeze.

Extended Forecast

Wednesday and Thursday: Fair and sunny skies with possible isolated thundershowers. Rainfall is expected to be between 0 and 15 mm.

Friday and Saturday, overcast skies with intermittent to continuous rain and scattered thundershowers. Rainfall is anticipated to be between 30 and 80mm. The highest rainfall is expected over coastal areas.

Sunday and Monday, cloudy skies with intermittent showers and isolated thundershowers. Rainfall is expected to be between 10 and 40 mm.
