Severe Weather Advisory: Moderate to strong winds and lightning strikes may occur over areas during thundershowers. Persons are asked to take the necessary precautions.

Marine Advisory:

- High energy, long period and spring tides will likely result in overtopping of river and sea defences and can also cause damages to sea defences in vulnerable areas. Persons residing along low-lying, riverine, and flood-prone areas are advised to take the necessary precautions to safeguard life and property. Strong surface winds will also result in rough and dangerous seas.

- Fisherfolks, small craft operators, and other marine users are advised to remain alert and exercise caution during this time.

Weather Brief for Monday, 20 October 2025 from the Hydrometeorological Service, Guyana.

Rainfall records for the past 24 hours, measured at 08:00hrs Monday, 20 October 2025 were available for most of the stations.

Enterprise in Region 4 recorded the highest rainfall of 21.0 mm.

Synopsis: The ITCZ in the wake of a Tropical Wave is affecting Guyana. This pattern is expected to continue throughout the week; however, the axis will be disorganized and meandering mostly over northern Guyana.

Today's weather review: Cloudy skies with occasional to frequent showers and thundershowers were observed across northern Guyana. Southern Guyana saw mostly sunny skies.

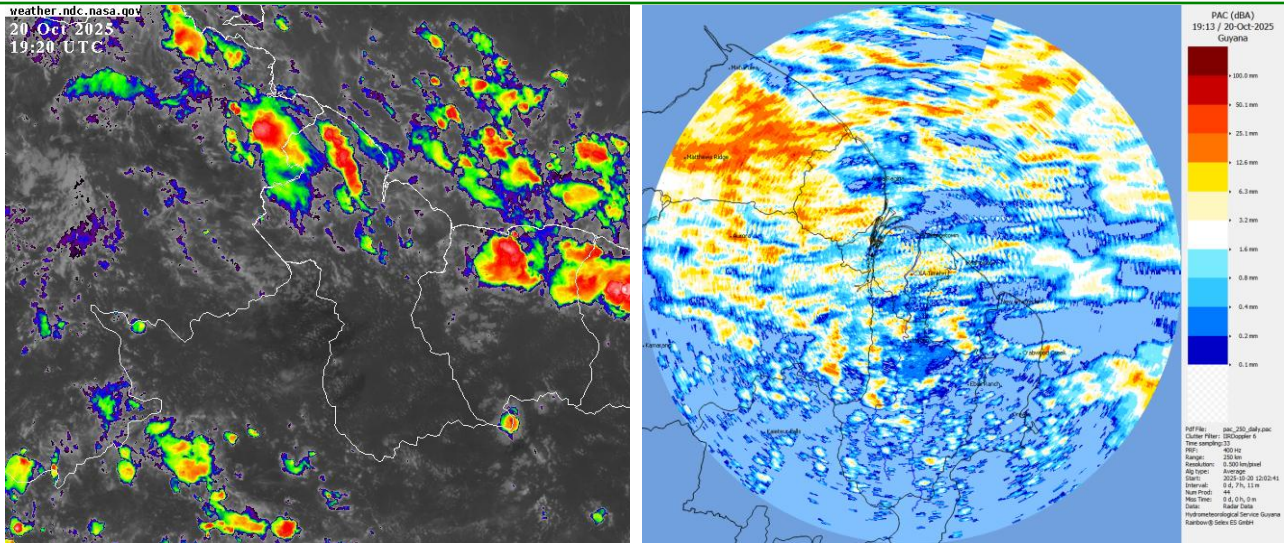

Rough seas with northerly swells reaching 2.5 to 3.0 meters in open waters.

- These waves will likely have periods of between 12 and 13 seconds.

- Moderate northeast to easterly breeze.

Extended Forecast

Wednesday thru Sunday: Partly cloudy to cloudy skies with scattered showers and isolated thundershowers during the early morning and early afternoon. Rainfall is anticipated to be between 0 and 20 mm within 24 hours of accumulation.
