Weather Brief for Tuesday, 28 October 2025 from the Hydrometeorological Service, Guyana.

Rainfall records for the past 24 hours, measured at 08:00hrs Tuesday, 28 October 2025 were available for most of the stations. Imbaimadai in Region 7 recorded the highest rainfall of 7.2 mm.

<u>Synopsis:</u> Dry and stable conditions continue across Guyana and will continue until Friday. Unstable conditions can be expected over the weekend.

<u>Today's weather review</u>: Apart from scattered showers and isolated thundershowers over areas of region 1, sunny skies were observed throughout Guyana.

Extended Forecast

<u>Thursday:</u> Partly cloudy to cloudy skies, scattered to occasional showers from mid-morning into the afternoon. Isolated thunderstorms can be expected over some coastal areas in the early afternoon. Rainfall is anticipated to be between 0 and 20 mm.

Friday, afternoon thundershowers over inland and interior locations. Rainfall is anticipated to be between 10 and 30 mm.

<u>Saturday and Sunday</u>, cloudy to overcast at times with frequent showers and rain. Thunderstorms are expected during the morning hours. Rainfall is anticipated to be between 20 and 60 mm, highest values likely on Saturday.
