WEATHER BRIEF for Monday 01 September 2025, from the Hydrometeorological Service, Guyana-

Rainfall records for the past 24 hours, measured at 08:00 hours on Monday, 01 September 2025, were available for some stations. **No significant rainfall was recorded.**

Synopsis: No significant Synopsis feature in the forecast area; however, local convection is expected to generate weak to moderate instability.

Weather review: Mostly sunny skies were interrupted by scattered showers in Regions 7, 8, 10, and the inland areas of Region 4.

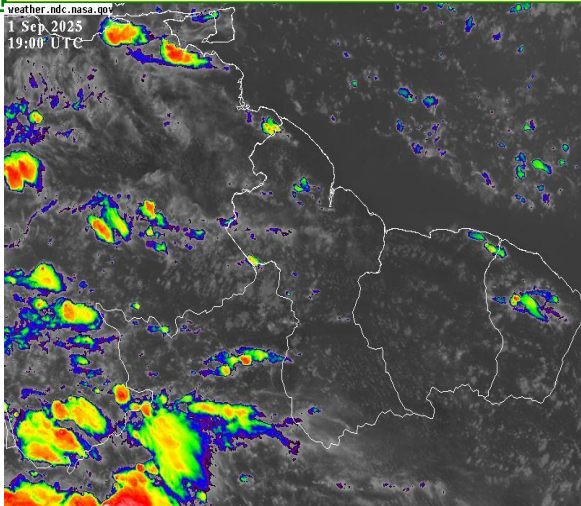

Georgetown's long-term daily average rainfall for the next 10 days, 01 to 10 September 2025, is 326mm per day.

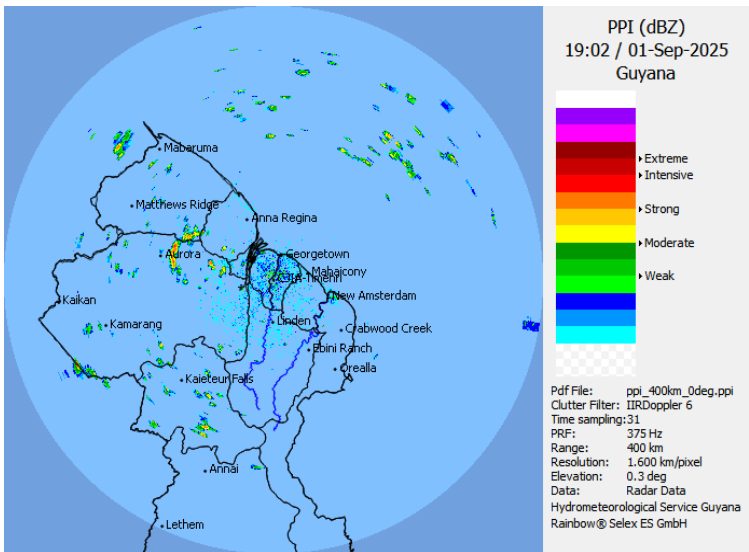
Weather Warnings: In areas of thundershowers, lightning strikes and heavy winds may be observed. Persons should exercise caution in efforts to safeguard life and property.

Saturday and Sunday: Partly cloudy to cloudy skies with occasional showers in Regions 1 to 4 and North Region 9. Elsewhere, scattered showers. **Rainfall between 0 and 20mm.**
