Rainfall records for the past 24 hours, measured at 08:00hrs Monday, 08 September 2025 were available for most of the stations.

No significant rainfall was recorded.

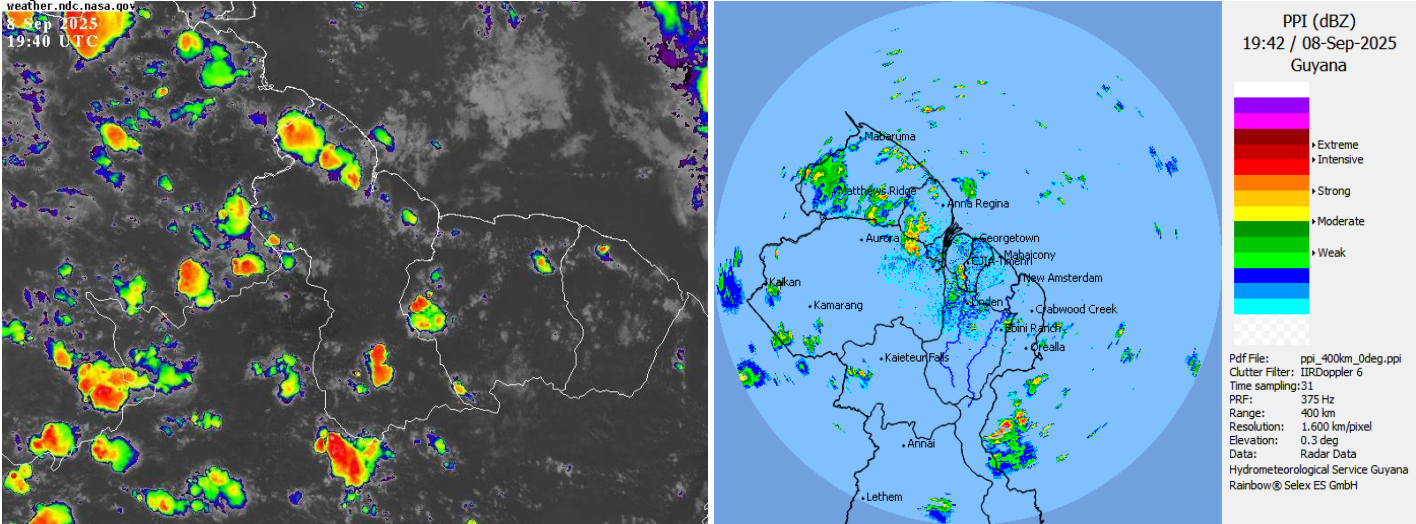
Synopsis: The ridge of high pressure is the dominant feature affecting Guyana.

Today's weather review: sunny skies were observed throughout Guyana with isolated showers over some coastal areas.

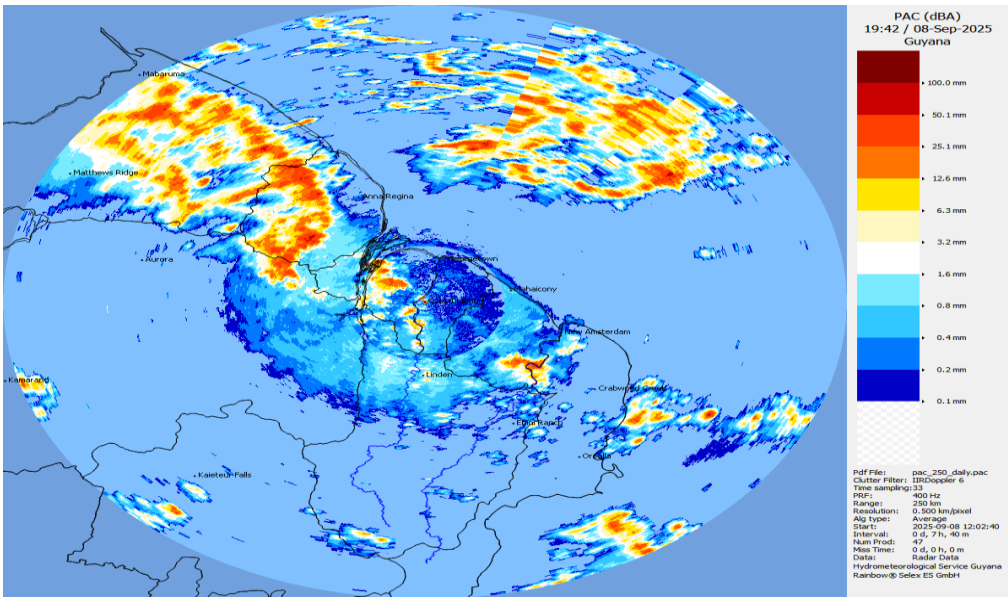

SPRING TIDE ADVISORY: Persons are reminded that the spring Tide advisory will remain effective until Friday, September 12, 2025. Spring tides coupled with high waves can lead to overtopping of the river and sea defence vulnerable areas. All necessary precautions should be taken.

Sea conditions:

Gentle in open waters with northeasterly waves reaching 1.0 to 1.5 meters (2 to 4 ft) and steady.

- These waves will likely have periods of 7 and 8 seconds.
- Gentle northeast to easterly breeze.

Extended Forecast

Wednesday to Sunday: Fair and sunny skies will be observed across Guyana, with isolated showers and possible thunderstorms. **No significant rainfall is anticipated with 24 hours of accumulation.**
