Weather Brief for Tuesday, 02 September 2025 from the Hydrometeorological Service, Guyana.



Rainfall records for the past 24 hours, measured at 08:00hrs Tuesday, 02 September 2025 were available for most of the stations.

Tract 'F' Bydarabu in Region 7 has the highest rainfall of 13.4m.

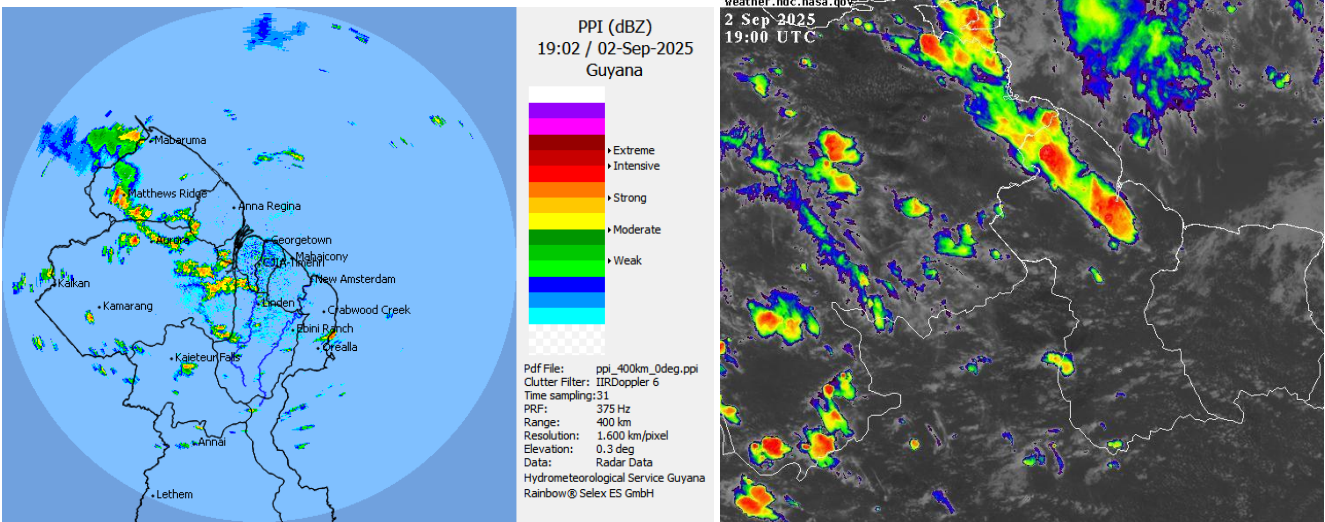
Synopsis: Isolated weak to moderate instabilities driven by confluence and local heating give rise to some areas of deep convection.

Today's weather review: Apart from isolated thundershowers over inland regions 1 to 5, partly cloudy and sunny skies were observed.

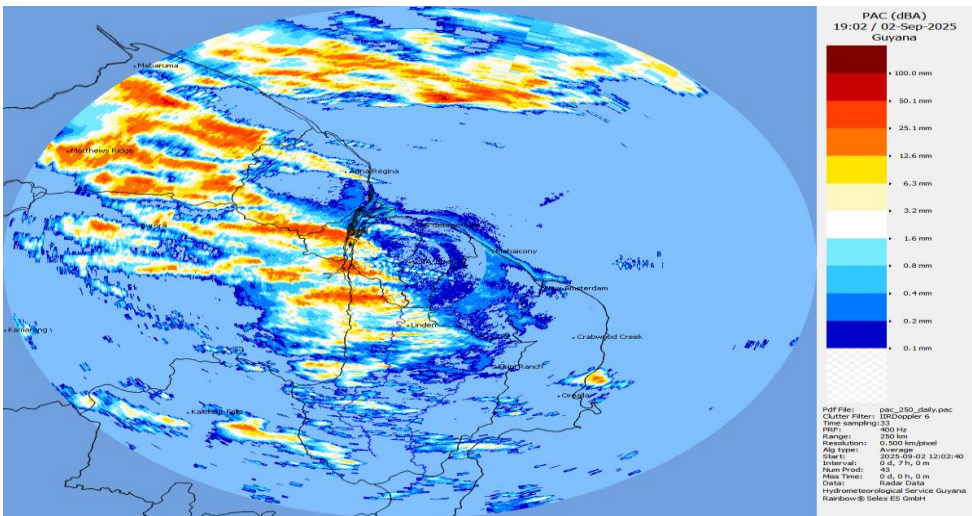

Sea conditions:

Smooth to moderate in open waters with northeast to easterly waves reaching 1.0 to 1.5 meters (2 to 4 ft) and steady.

- These waves will likely have periods of 5 and 8 seconds.
- Gentle to moderate Easterly breeze.

Extended Forecast

Thursday: Partly cloudy to cloudy skies with occasional showers and isolated thundershowers in the early morning and mid-afternoon.

Rainfall is expected to be between 10 and 25 mm.

Friday to Sunday: Partly cloudy and sunny skies in the morning. In the early afternoon, isolated thundershowers can be expected.

Rainfall is expected to be between 0 and 15 mm.

Tuesday: Partly cloudy and sunny skies across Guyana. No significant rainfall is likely.
