Weather Brief for Saturday, 06 September 2025 from the Hydrometeorological Service, Guyana.

Rainfall records for the past 24 hours, measured at 08:00hrs Saturday, 06 September 2025 were available for most of the stations.
Hossororo in Region 1 recorded the highest rainfall of 39.2mm.


Synopsis: Weak instabilities driven by localised heating are affecting Guyana.

Today's weather review: Apart from isolated showers, mostly fair and sunny skies were observed across Guyana.



SPRING TIDE ADVISORY: Persons are reminded that the spring Tide advisory will remain effective until Friday, September 12, 2025.

MARINE ADVISORY: Residents of low-lying, riverine, and flood-prone areas are advised to take the necessary precautions against flooding, as over-topping is likely.

Sea conditions:

Gentle in open waters with northeasterly waves reaching 1.0 to 1.5 meters (3 to 5 ft) and steady.

- These waves will likely have periods of 7 and 8 seconds.
- Gentle easterly breeze.

Extended Forecast

Monday to Friday: Mix of sunshine and clouds with brief passing showers in the morning and isolated thunderstorms in the early afternoon. **Rainfall is anticipated to be between 5 and 15 mm within 24 hours.**
